From the Rabbi ...

THE WESTERN WALL IS HOLY AGAIN!

On my very first visit to Israel when I was in 10th grade, I was emotionally touched by going up to the Wall on the women's side and putting a note in the cracks of the Wall because of what it symbolized. It was just three years after the 6-Day War and I remembered seeing photographs of soldiers at the Wall holding their helmets in their hands. They had breeched the outer walls of the Old City and made it to The Western Wall.

My later experiences at the Wall were not so positive. With time, the Israeli government gave control of the Wall area to the Ultra-Orthodox who imposed their version of Judaism on the rest of us. It was no longer a place for ALL Jews. As a rabbinic student in Israel, I experienced a prayer service with Women of the Wall in which the women prayed out loud at the risk of being attacked by the orthodox men over the *mehitzah* (the wall the separates the men from the women). As women tried to gain more rights on the women's side of the Wall, such as being able to wear a Tallit or reading from the Torah, for me the Wall became a symbol of political strife, segregation, and discrimination against women. Israel was the only country in which it was OK to arrest a Jewish woman for wearing a Tallit there. When I took congregational trips to Israel, I would tell the group to feel free to go up to the Wall on the appropriate men's or women's side, while I would stay in the back. Being near the Wall made me too upset, aggravated, and angry.

Now that has changed. Last month I had the special opportunity to attend the CCAR (America Reform rabbis organization) Conference, which took place in Israel. One of the most moving experiences for me was praying with my colleagues at the Western Wall, but not the usual place most people think of as the Western Wall. Two weeks before we arrived in Israel for the conference, a miracle occurred. The Israeli government agreed to create a co-ed prayer space on the southern side of the Western Wall. We were the first group to be able to pray there after the Knesset decision. (For the past few years, groups could pray there, but you had to get special permission and enter through a museum to get to that side of the Wall. It made you feel like an outsider and an intruder.) The government will redesign the full Western Wall Plaza so that there will be equal access to all three sections, (men, women, co-ed) and the area will be expanded to allow for larger groups to

participate. The Israeli government will once again be able to conduct co-ed military ceremonies at the Wall plaza, which the Ultra-Orthodox had prohibited.

Praying with my colleagues brought back that holy feeling I had the first time I came to the Wall, but this time I could pray as I wanted, singing the prayers out loud while wearing a Tallit along with the other men and women of the CCAR. I am an eternal optimist. I truly believe that once the new renovations are complete, this side will be the "go to" side for any one visiting Israel because you will feel welcomed and accepted. And it is actually the holier side of the Western Wall. If you look at the photo, you will see large boulders in the area. These are remnants of the



Second Temple. When the Roman's destroyed The Temple they threw these stones down from the Temple Mount. The Northern side of the Western Wall does not have any of these stones. It is only a retaining wall that surrounded the Temple Mount. So praying at the Southern Plaza you can actually touch remnants of the Temple. The Western Wall is holy again for me.




