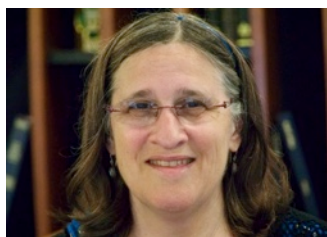

From the Rabbi...

Learn About The New High Holy Day Mahzor

What do we expect when we open up a High Holy Day prayerbook? As we go through the High Holy Day season, we have many emotions as we remember the past, expectations as we anticipate the coming year, and spiritual goals as we try to find meaning in our lives. The rabbi, cantor, and gathered community provide inspiration. The *mahzor* provides both a script and a springboard for our efforts. We find meaning and comfort with the old familiar prayers, but also look for new words of inspiration and guidance. The new Reform *mahzor*, *Mishkan Hanefesh*, tries to do both – maintain the old yet offer new opportunities for reflection on these holy days.

But transition is sometimes difficult. Since the new *mahzor* comes in two volumes, one for Rosh Hashanah and one for Yom Kippur, we will be able to take time to get used to the transition. This fall, we will be using the new Reform High Holy *mahzor* for Rosh Hashanah, and the older Gates of Repentance (maroon books) for Yom Kippur. It will also be less expensive since we can buy only the Rosh Hashanah book this year, at half the cost.

I will hold a meeting at two different times to introduce the congregation to the new *mahzor* and learn all of the benefits of using the new book – **Thursday, August 11th at 3 PM after Sholom University classes or Friday, August 12th before Shabbat services at 6:30 PM.** Please attend one of the meetings so you can hold the book in your hands and see the beautiful way the book is laid out, enabling us to have transliteration of the Hebrew as well as several options for the English. In addition there are many options for you to do reading on your own during the service to explore areas of interest connected to the themes of the High Holy Days. **Please consider making a donation of \$18 towards the purchase of a Rosh Hashanah book.** You can dedicate the book to a loved one. See the order form on the right. Forms are also available in the temple office.

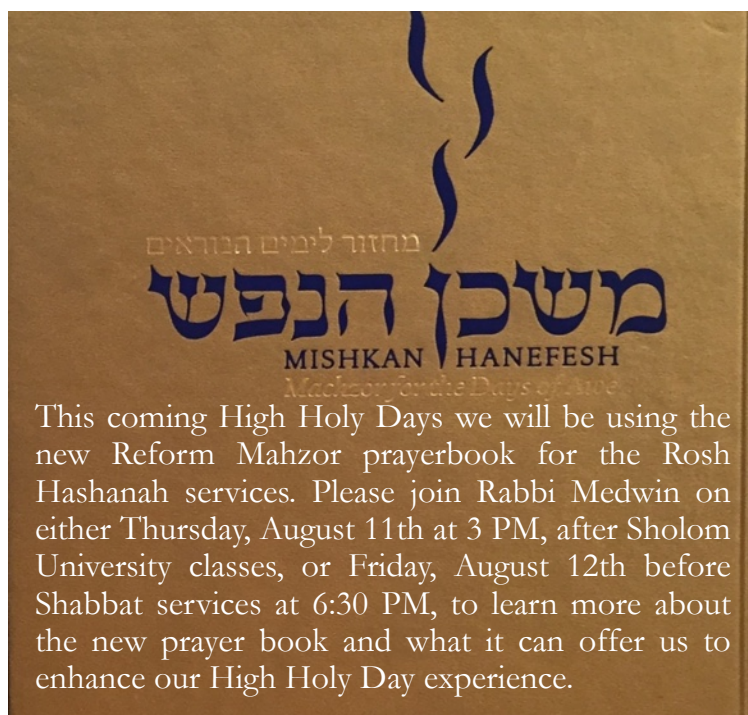

18 Voices Sing Kol Nidre: The Secrets of a Sacred Chant From Those Who Have Been Touched By It



How did the Kol Nidre become a Jewish anthem and an object of intense interest for non-Jews?

We find out when 18 voices sing Kol Nidre, when 18 storytellers share their tales, their anecdotes, about the prayer. Some are top experts on the chant, some are just those who have been changed by chanting it. Each tells his or her story with the help of unique visuals and a unique musical setting for the haunting melody.

The 18 voices—18 storytellers—include a Hassidic rabbi who tells the tale of a stable boy who is illiterate and can't read the Kol Nidre prayer, an African-American author Julius Lester, a convert to Judaism as an adult, a legal scholar who goes back to the Middle Ages to paint the scene, a film critic who shows how the prayer burst onto the general pop scene with the first talking film, "The Jazz Singer" in 1927, and a composer who demonstrates how the chant has reached beyond Jewish circles.

In short, we learn the secrets of a sacred chant from those who have been touched by it.
