From the Rabbi...

“Let The Earth Be Glad”

For eleven years I have been traveling back and forth from Binghamton, where my physical home is, to Monticello, where my spiritual home is. While it is a long commute, there are several things that make the commute easier. One is to listen to audio books. Sometimes when I need to be uplifted, I turn to my playlist of Jewish prayers. One song in particular helps me to appreciate and really take notice of the beauty of nature that surrounds me as I drive down Route 17. It is based on Psalm 92, which is recited on Shabbat.

“Tov l’hodot l’Adonai. It is good to give thanks to God.

On this day of days, my lips shall sing Your praise, for I know that You’ll always be here surrounding me.”

As I am surrounded by trees, river, and flowers - God’s creations, I therefore also feel surrounded by God.

Sometimes in the busy hustle of life, it is easy to take for granted that we live in such a beautiful area, and the spiritual strength we can gather from such surroundings. That is why I created “Shabbat in the Park.” It forces us to take time to appreciate Shabbat in the context of God’s creations. The Shabbat Kiddush says, “In love and favor, You made the holy Shabbat our heritage as a reminder of the work of Creation.” The *Maariv* prayer reminds us, “You arrange the stars in their heavenly courses. You are Creator of day and night.” How much more meaningful are these prayers when we read them immersed in the beautiful world that God created.
