

Sholom Jewish University Summer Semester 2016



Sholom Jewish University – Summer 2016- 5776 At Temple Sholom, Monticello, NY

All classes are **open to the community**. Please tell your friends and neighbors. Classes begin the week of **July 5** and run through **August 29**th.

MONDAYS:

1. Modern Israeli Poetry - Mondays, 4:30-5:45 PM - Teacher: Gandalf (Bob Rosengard) Start date: July 11 (Note: No class July 4th)

Israeli poetry – Contemporary and 20th/21st century. Emphasis will be on content and style with a focus on critical analyses.

TUESDAYS:

2. Beginner Hebrew - Tuesdays, 10:45 AM-11:45 PM - Teacher: Lauren Miller

Learn how to recognize and sound out the Hebrew letters and vowels, and put them together to read words. No experience needed.

3. The Bible's Many Voices - Tuesdays, Noon-1:15 PM - Teacher: Rabbi Michele Medwin

The Bible is made up of many separate books with many different writers. We will learn about the different voices expressed by the authors. With this format we will explore the important messages the authors wanted to transmit, seeing the Bible anew, as a living work whose many voices tell us about the world out of which the Bible grew. Some of the categories we will look at are historical voices, theological voices, legal voices, women's voices, voices of the wise, foreign voices, and voices of song and legend. We will use the book, *The Bible's Many Voices*, by Michael Carasik. (Purchasing the book is optional. Rabbi will teach from the book assuming you don't have the book.) You will need a Tanakh, an English version of the Hebrew Bible.

4. Two Rabbis' Views of Why Bad Things Happen - Tue, 1:30-2:45 PM - Teacher: Rabbi Medwin

We will compare and contrast the teachings of two rabbis' as to why bad things happen to us and our loved ones. Please purchase When Bad Things Happen to Good People by Rabbi Harold Kushner and If God is Good, Why is the World So Bad? By Rabbi Benjamin Blech.

After personal tragedy, Rabbi Kushner, a Conservative Rabbi, who was taught that God rewards the good and punishes the bad, came to see God as he never had before – a God who *does* weep with us, *won't* abandon us, and can fill the deepest needs of an anguished heart.

Rabbi Blech's book covers the following ideas: If I suffer, does that mean I deserve it? Why do innocent people, especially children, die tragically? How can God be so cruel? Does God ever intervene during times of trouble? Who really runs the world-God or man? Do my prayers do any good? Why does God allow sickness, torture and evil to exist? Benjamin Blech, a modern orthodox rabbi and Talmud Professor, admits the answers are not simple. There is no one-size-fits-all explanation. Indeed, not only are there many answers, but in different situations several explanations may apply. Blech wrote this book as an intellectual analysis of Jewish wisdom on the subject of suffering. His theories are the fruit of thousands of years of debate, examination and struggle. Jewish wisdom teaches that there are rich and inspiring answers to the ultimate question: If God is good, why is the world so bad?

THURSDAYS:

5. Conversational Hebrew for Beginners - Thursdays, 10:45-11:45 AM - Teacher: Stephanie Phillips

This course in modern Israeli Hebrew will emphasize speaking. Students will learn through hearing and repetition with the help of recorded segments. Being able to pronounce words by reading Hebrew letters isn't absolutely necessary if a student is willing to use his or her own notation and memorize spoken words. Textbook required: *Ivrit Alfon: A Hebrew Primer for Adults* sold at http://www.behrmanhouse.com/store/product-sku/463. Used books from Amazon.

6. Jewish Film Discussion - Thursdays, Noon-2:30 PM - Teacher: Rabbi Michele Medwin

We will be watching and discussing various Jewish films, stopping in the middle to discuss the various issues that each film brings up. (Note: You must register for the entire course to watch any of the movies shown.) The movies are divided into three themes:

- 1 Aftermath of the Holocaust: Remembrance, What Our Fathers Did, The Long Way Home
- 2. Israeli Society: The Prime Ministers, Beneath the Helmet, Gett
- 3. Jewish Identity: A Borrowed Identity, Little White Lie
