What is a D.Min. Degree?

In the middle of this month I will be walking down the aisle at Temple Emanuel in New York City to receive my D.Min. degree. I have spent the last two-and-a-half years taking classes at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of New York, providing counseling in various settings, and working on my D.Min. project researching and counseling Alzheimer's families. I chose this topic for my senior project to honor the memory of my father. The degree in its entirety is called, "Doctor of Ministry in Clinical and Pastoral and Counseling."

How does Pastoral Counseling differ from standard mental health counseling? It is an integration of both the spiritual and the psychological. Pastoral counselors approach the challenges of life from a holistic understanding combining spiritual, biological, psychological, social, and cultural factors. I decided to pursue this degree because, in addition to my usual rabbinic duties, I wanted to be able to help the members of Temple Sholom the best way I could.

We all have struggles in our lives. I have learned to understand them from both a psychological and spiritual perspective, using both the wise teachings of the Torah and our Sages along with psychology to help seek out answers. With all the travails of life, Judaism has always been there for us, providing a source of comfort and strength. Combining modern psychology with the traditions of our heritage, I am here to help you cope with the challenges in your life. 


