From the Rabbi...

Tu B'Shevat
The Jewish Arbor Day

In Leviticus 19:23-25 we read, "When you enter the land and plant any tree for food, you shall regard its fruit as forbidden. Three years it shall be forbidden for you, not to be eaten. In the fourth year all its fruit shall be set aside for jubilation before Adonai, and only in the fifth year may you use its fruit — that its yield to you may be increased: I Adonai am your God." This is the first time a specific holiday regarding counting the years of a tree is found in the Mishnah (Part of the Talmud). Hillel says that the proper date to begin counting is Tu (15th) of Shevat. So if you plant a tree on the 14th of Shevat, it is considered one year old on Tu B'Shevat.

While it is not a "religious" holiday, there are several customs that have developed to celebrate Tu B'Shevat. One is to eat from the Seven Species mentioned in the Torah: wheat, barley, grapes, figs, pomegranates, olives, and dates (or honey from the dates). Some plant trees in Israel specifically on this date. In the 17th century, Kabbalists developed a ritual based on the Passover seder to celebrate the spiritual significance of fruits and nuts.

Join us at Temple Sholom on Friday, February 10, at 6 PM for our Tu B'Shevat Shabbat seder where we will recite the Shabbat prayers, celebrate the beauty and importance of trees, and learn about the spiritual meaning of various fruits and nuts, as we enjoy eating these special foods.




