From the Rabbi...

Mishkan HaNefesh for Yom Kipper

"Prayer is more than merely reciting words; it's about encountering aspects of ourselves we rarely if ever see, shifting our perspective and seeing all things anew, awakening our spirits and sense of wonder. Prayer is about connection - with ourselves, with a community of other seekers, and with Someone or Something beyond ourselves... On the High Holy Days we also try to get past our self-judgment and locate a place of gentleness and tenderness - that place where we feel deeply loved and valued, and where we feel most loving of others. Even if just for a moment." (Rabbi Jan Uhrbach, Mishkan HaNefesh)

More than just the Hebrew words of the prayers, a mahzor, (High Holy Day prayerbook), has the responsibility of inspiring us towards being a better person, feeling good about ourselves and others, and looking forward to a new year with a clean slate. Last year we had the wonderful opportunity to use the new Mishkan HaNefesh Mahzor for Rosh Hashanah. In addition to transliteration for every Hebrew prayer, it also offered us wonderful creative alternative prayers, inspirational additional English readings, readings for individual reflection, and text study.

The above quote comes from the new CCAR Mishkan Hanefesh Yom Kippur volume. This is just an example of the wonderful additions to the new prayerbook. Because there are so many additional readings, the new CCAR Mahzor comes in two volumes - one for Rosh Hashanah and one for Yom Kippur. We know how meaningful Rosh Hashanah was using the new book. This year we would like to purchase the Yom Kippur Mahzor to enhance our Yom Kippur worship experience as well.

If you have not yet done so, please consider donating a new Yom Kippur book to the temple. We can have a bookplate made in memory of, or in honor of, or just because... Books are \$18 each and \$40 for a large print version. Forms are available in the Harbinger or from the temple office.

- August 3: Ida (2013) Anna, a young novitiate nun in 1960s Poland is on the verge of taking her vows when she discovers a dark family secret dating back to the years of the German occupation. [Polish, Latin, French English subtitles] [Oscar Winner Best Foreign Language Film] Time [1:22]
- August 10: Remember (2015) With the aid of fellow Auschwitz survivor and a hand-written letter, an elderly man with dementia goes in search of the person responsible for the death of his family. Meet author Elaine Freed Lindenblatt and hear the inside story of how Reuben Freed's roadside eatery became the famous Red Apple Rest.

The **Red Apple Rest** was a legendary restaurant open from the 1930s through the 1980s on New York's Route 17. Located midway between New York City and the resorts of the Catskill Mountains, the restaurant served a who's who of entertainment luminaries.





Elaine Freed Lindenblatt was born into restaurant royalty as the youngest child of the establishment's founder, Reuben Freed. For her, the Red Apple was the "family room" across the road—one she shared with over a million customers every year. In this book fifty-plus years unfold in a series of lively vignettes—enhanced with photos, memorabilia, and even a closely guarded recipe—as she recreates what it was like to be raised in the fishbowl of a round-the-clock family operation. Stop at the Red Apple is at once an account of growing up in 1950s small-town USA, a glimpse into the workings of a successful food operation, and a swan song to a glorious slice of bygone popular culture.
