## Mishkan HaNefesh for Yom Kippur

“Prayer is more than merely reciting words; it’s about encountering aspects of ourselves we rarely if ever see, shifting our perspective and seeing all things anew, awakening our spirits and sense of wonder. Prayer is about connection - with ourselves, with a community of other seekers, and with Someone or Something beyond ourselves... On the High Holy Days we also try to get past our self-judgment and locate a place of gentleness and tenderness – that place where we feel deeply loved and valued, and where we feel most loving of others. Even if just for a moment.” (Rabbi Jan Uhrbach, Mishkan HaNefesh)

More than just the Hebrew words of the prayers, a *mahzor*, (High Holy Day prayerbook), has the responsibility of inspiring us towards being a better person, feeling good about ourselves and others, and looking forward to a new year with a clean slate. Last year we had the wonderful opportunity to use the new Mishkan HaNefesh *Mahzor* for Rosh Hashanah. In addition to transliteration for every Hebrew prayer, it also offered us wonderful creative alternative prayers, inspirational additional English readings, readings for individual reflection, and text study.

The above quote comes from the new CCAR Mishkan Hanefesh Yom Kippur volume. This is just an example of the wonderful additions to the new prayerbook. Because there are so many additional readings, the new CCAR Mahzor comes in two volumes – one for Rosh Hashanah and one for Yom Kippur. We know how meaningful Rosh Hashanah was using the new book. This year we would like to purchase the Yom Kippur Mahzor to enhance our Yom Kippur worship experience as well.

If you have not yet done so, please consider donating a new Yom Kippur book to the temple. We can have a bookplate made in memory of, or in honor of, or just because... Books are \$18 each and \$40 for a large print version. Forms are available in the Harbinger or from the temple office.

- ❖ **July 6: Hester Street** (1975) – Yankel Bogovnik, a Russian Jew, emigrated to the U.S in 1893 and settled on Hester Street on the Lower East Side of New York City. Three years later his wife and son join him but the assimilated “Jake” is displeased with his old-world wife. [Oscar Nominee Best Actress in a Leading Role – Carol Kane] **Time [1:29]**
- ❖ **July 13: Gett: The Trial of Viviane Asalem** (2014) – After an unhappy marriage of over twenty years, a woman appeals to her husband’s compassion to obtain a divorce in front of a court. (Hebrew/French/Arabic – English subtitles) [Winner, Best Film of the Israeli Film Academy 2014; Golden Globe Nominee for Best Foreign Language Film] **Time [1:55]**
- ❖ **July 20: The Search** (1948) – In post-war Berlin, an American private helps a lost Czech boy find his mother. [Oscar winner for best writing of motion picture story, Golden Globe winner for best screenplay; Oscar Nominee Best Actor in a Leading Role – Montgomery Clift] **Time [1:44]**
- ❖ **July 27: Denial** (2016) – Acclaimed writer and historian Deborah E. Lipstadt must battle for historical truth to prove the Holocaust actually occurred when David Irving, a renowned denier, sues her for libel. [BAFTA Film Award Nominee Outstanding British Film of the Year] **Time [1:49]**
- ❖ **August 3: Ida** (2013) – Anna, a young novitiate nun in 1960s Poland is on the verge of taking her vows when she discovers a dark family secret dating back to the years of the German occupation. [Polish, Latin, French – English subtitles] [Oscar Winner Best Foreign Language Film] **Time [1:22]**
- ❖ **August 10: Remember** (2015) – With the aid of fellow Auschwitz survivor and a hand-written letter, an elderly man with dementia goes in search of the person responsible for the death of his family. [Canadian Screen Award Winner for Original Screenplay; Canadian Screen Nominee for Best Motion Picture, Canadian Screen Award Nominee for Performance by an Actor in a leading Role – Christopher Plummer] **Time [1:34]**
- ❖ **August 17: Enemies, A Love Story** (1989) – A ghostwriter finds himself romantically involved with his current wife, a married woman, and his long-vanished wife. [Oscar nominee for Best Actress in a Supporting Role – Anjelica Huston; Oscar Nominee Best Actress in a Supporting Role – Lena Olin] **Time [1:59]**
- ❖ **August 31: Crossing Delancey** (1988) – A Manhattan single meets a man through her Jewish grandmother’s matchmaker. [Golden Globe Nominee Best Performance by an Actress – Amy Irving] **Time [1:37]**

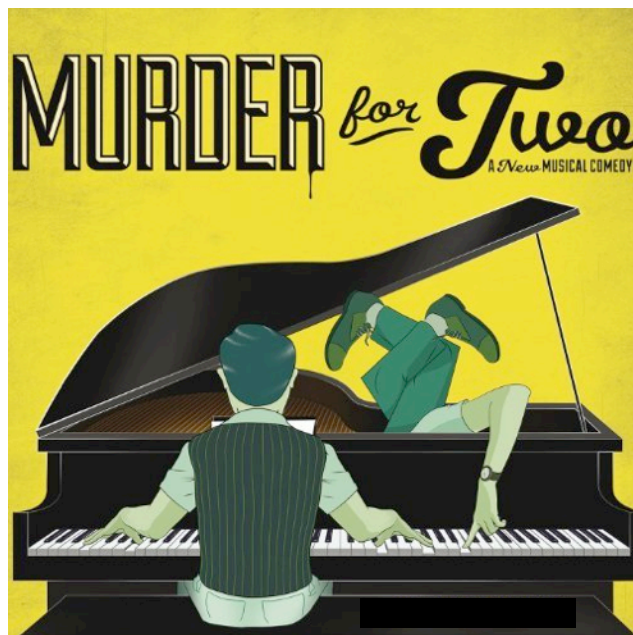

The **Red Apple Rest** was a legendary restaurant open from the 1930s through the 1980s on New York's Route 17. Located midway between New York City and the resorts of the Catskill Mountains, the restaurant served a who's who of entertainment luminaries.



**Elaine Freed Lindenblatt** was born into restaurant royalty as the youngest child of the establishment's founder, Reuben Freed. For her, the Red Apple was the "family room" across the road—one she shared with over a million customers every year. In this book fifty-plus years unfold in a series of lively vignettes—enhanced with photos, memorabilia, and even a closely guarded recipe—as she recreates what it was like to be raised in the fishbowl of a round-the-clock family operation. *Stop at the Red Apple* is at once an account of growing up in 1950s small-town USA, a glimpse into the workings of a successful food operation, and a swan song to a glorious slice of bygone popular culture.

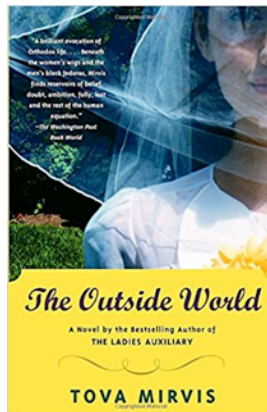

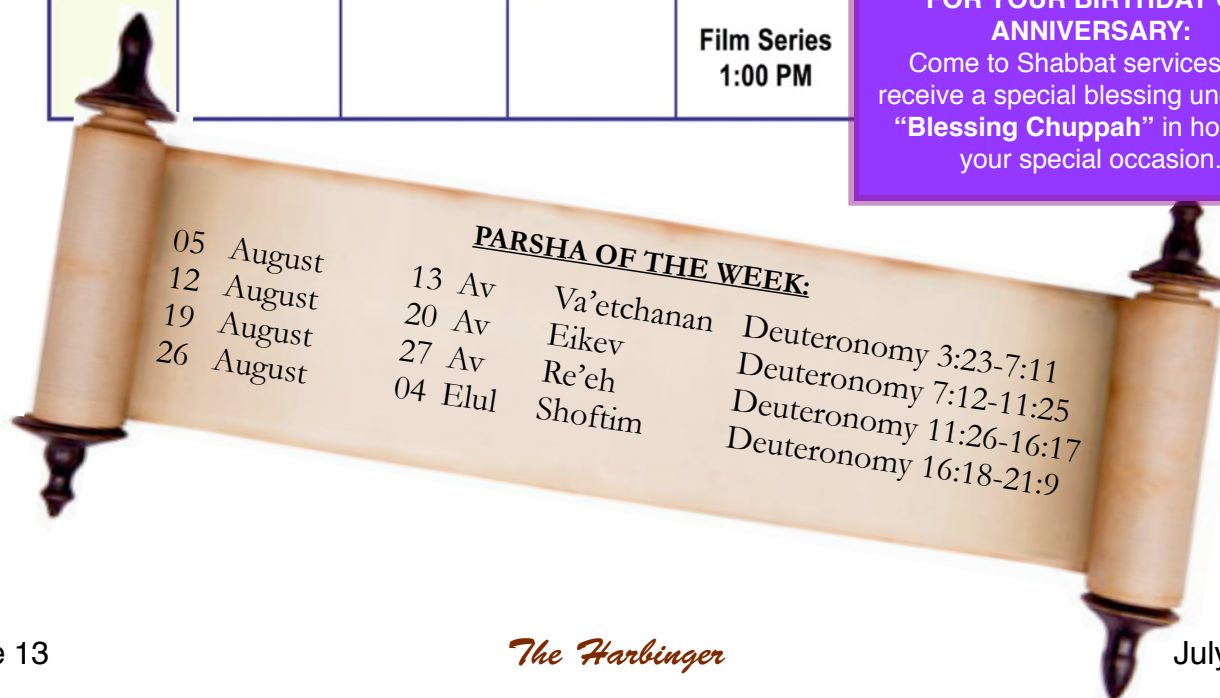
