From the Rabbi...

Jewish Ethics in the Torah

While there are various denominations in Judaism that practice the Jewish religion in different ways, there is one thing that we all have in common. We all value and use the Torah as a guide for ethical and moral behavior. Among all of the ritual commandments, the Torah is filled with guidelines on how to be holy. Living a holy life is not a life filled with ritual, but a life lived by Jewish ethics and values. We all know that the Torah teaches us to "welcome the stranger because you were strangers in the land of Egypt." We are also commanded to leave the "corners of our fields" for the poor. This summer, as part of Sholom Jewish University, we will explore the ethics of the book of Genesis as described by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. He explains, "The Torah in Genesis I is telling us something radical. The reality to which Torah is a guide is moral and ethical. The question Genesis seeks to answer is not 'How did the universe come into being?' but 'How then shall we live?' This is the Torah's most significant paradigm shift... For the first time, religion was ethicized." Join us this summer as we learn about Rabbi Sack's ethical teachings on the book of Genesis. TUESDAYS

Essays on Ethics: Weekly Reading of the Jewish Bible – Tuesdays, Noon-1:15 PM (Taught by Rabbi Medwin) Classes Start on Tuesday, June 27th, 2017.

No religion has held a higher view of humanity than the Torah, which tells us we are each in the image and likeness of God. Yet, none has been more honest about the failings of even the greatest. God does not ask us to be perfect. He asks us, instead, to take the risks in pursuit of the right and the good, and to acknowledge the mistakes we will inevitably make. We will be using the book, *Essays on Ethics: Weekly Reading of the Jewish Bible* by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks to learn about the ethics taught in the Torah. This summer we will concentrate on the book of Genesis, covering the following topics: The Genesis of Justice, Beyond Nature, How Perfect Were the Patriarchs and Matriarchs?, The Binding of Isaac, The Kindness of Strangers, Was Jacob Right to Take the Blessing?, Love is Not Enough, The Parable of the Tribes, The Heroism of Tamar, Appearance and Reality, The Birth of Forgiveness, When is One Permitted to Tell a Lie?

Connecting to God: Ancient Kabbalah and Modern Psychology – Tuesdays, 1:30-2:45 PM (Taught by Rabbi Medwin) Classes Start on Tuesday, June 27th, 2017.

We will be using the book, *Connecting to God: Ancient Kabbalah and Modern Psychology*, by Rabbi Abner Weiss, Ph.D. Rabbi Weiss has a unique way of teaching Kabbalah. We will learn about the Ten *Sefirot* of the Tree of Life, the basis for Kabbalah, which are the transformers of divine energy in our bodies and the building blocks of creation. To help understand the *Sefirot* from a personal perspective Rabbi Weiss explains the Sefirot in the context of modern psychology and gives us a spiritual approach to the psychological challenges we face in our lives.

3. Hebrew Level 2 Taught by Lauren Miller – (check with Lauren for days and times - lauren.miller13@gmail.com)

This class will cover major and minor prayers, their meaning, vocabulary and reading from our prayer book. Prerequisite Hebrew 1 or equivalent.

THURSDAYS

4. Jewish Film Discussion - Thursdays, noon – 2:30 PM, Discussion led by Gandalf (Robert) Rosengard. Classes begin July 6, 2017

We will be watching and discussing various Jewish films and stopping in the middle to discuss the various issues that each film brings up. Note: You must register for the entire course to watch any of the movies shown. The following movies will be shown and discussed:

- **Dough** With his business faltering, Jewish baker Nat is under pressure from his son to close down his shop. The arrival of a young Muslim apprentice puts an unexpected charge in Nat's sales.
- **Denial** In the 1990's, well-known Holocaust denier David Irving sued historian Deborah Lipstadt, issuing a complaint under British law requiring the American academic to prove that the greatest atrocity of World War II actually took place. (Based on a true story.)
- **Run Boy Run** On the run after fleeing the Warsaw ghetto during World War II's darkest days, an 8-year-old Jewish boy is by no means out of danger as he must scrounge for food and shelter and disguise his faith if he is to survive. (Based on a true story.)
- **Zero Motivation** Serving out their required term in the military, a collection of young Israeli soldiers are posted to a desolate base in the middle of the desert. As their collective boredom mounts, personal frictions begin to surface among the all-female company.
- **Censored Voices** In 1967, author Amoz Oz and editor Avraham Shapira taperecorded the sentiments of Israeli soldiers returning from the Six-Day War. This riveting documentary combines that long-censored audio with archival clips to provide a personal picture of war.
- **A Tale of Love and Darkness** Bringing to life the memoir of celebrated Israeli author Amos Oz, this affecting drama depicts his early years, when his family was swept up in the turbulence and violence of Israel's founding as a nation.
- **Son of Saul** Amid the horrors of Auschwitz, prisoner Saul Auslander has the grim duty of transporting corpses from the camp's gas chambers to the crematoria. But when he thinks he recognizes his son's body, Saul sets out to save the boy from incineration.
- **History of the World: Part I** Mel Brooks' comic genius is unleashed in this episodic spoof of history's seminal moments such as the Stone Age, the Roman Empire, the Spanish Inquisition, and ends with a clever take off of the French Revolution. Narrated by Orson Wells.
- **Great Writers: Isaac Bashevis Singer** Explore the written works of Isaac Bashevis Singer (1904-1991) in this documentary that examines the life and times of the Polish-born Jewish-American author. The popular film Yentl starring Barbra Streisand was based on his story, "Yentl the Yeshiva Boy."


