Give Thanks

While Thanksgiving is a secular American holiday, the theme of giving thanks is a very Jewish one. In the Torah we are reminded to give thanks. "*When you have eaten your fill, give **thanks** to Adonai your God for the good land which God has given you.*" (Deut. 8:10) This verse is included in the *Birkat Hamzon*, the prayer after eating a meal.

In Jeremiah we read: "*Give **thanks** to the LORD of Hosts, for the Adonai is good, for God's kindness is everlasting!*" (Jer. 33:11)

Psalms also reminds us to be thankful and appreciate what God has given us but the Hebrew is often translated as "praise."



*O you faithful of Adonai, sing to God, and **praise** God's holy name. (Psa. 30:5)*

***Praise** God with the lyre; with the ten-stringed harp sing to God; (Psa. 33:2)*

*Hallelujah. **Praise** Adonai for God is good; God's steadfast love is eternal. (Psa. 106:1)*

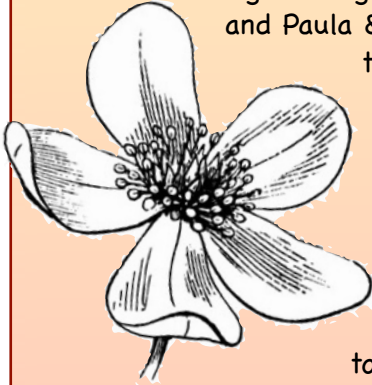

Temple Beautification Committee

Every month the **Board of Trustees** meets to evaluate and address whatever is necessary to ensure that Temple Sholom continues to be a vibrant part of the Jewish community in Sullivan County.

The board takes up issues or concerns that are raised by board members or by congregation members. All stakeholders of Temple Sholom are encouraged to attend board meetings. If you have any questions or concerns or suggestions you should feel free to bring them to the board. *[November 21 at 6:30 PM]*

To keep the congregation up-to-date on the workings behind the scenes, selected parts of the board meeting minutes will be presented in *The Harbinger*.

Building Maintenance Committee Report:

The downstairs dehumidifiers are now self-emptying and the bathroom doors have been vented to produce a healthier basement environment.

Our occasional flooding in the bathroom corner was caused by a downspout problem, which has been taken care of. Also the pump in that corner is now on a quarterly maintenance schedule.

Five of the green chairs in the sanctuary are damaged and have been taken out of circulation, awaiting repair. We have several dozen black cushioned chairs in reserve; most of these need minor repairs too.

The emergency exit platform on the shed side of the building has been reinforced. Thank you Phil Schroeder for overseeing this.

Our old oil tank was successfully removed and replaced. Thank you Marty Miller for your guidance.

The walkway into the temple has been improved. Thank you Judy Cutler for overseeing this project.

New lighter and sturdier oneg tables have replaced the old ones.

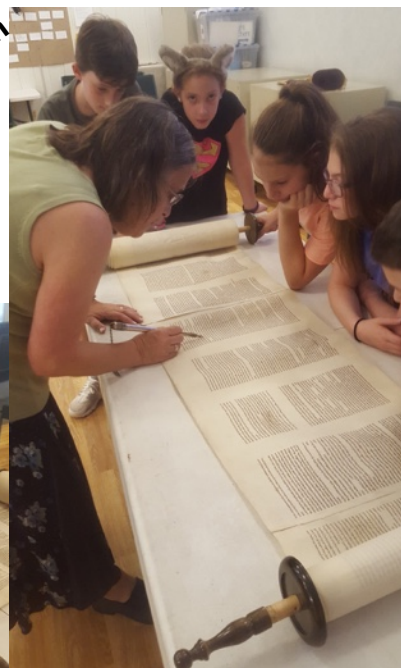
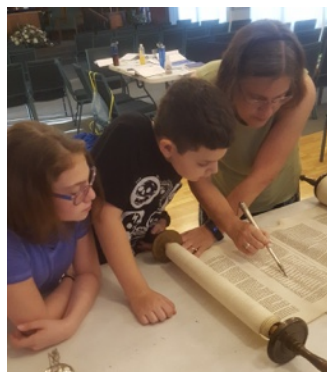

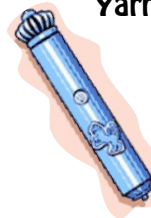
