From: the Rabbi...

Sukkat Shlomecha -Your Sukkah of Peace

Having finished the solemnity and serious work of the High Holy Days we now move into the holiday of Sukkot, often referred to as Z'man Simchteinu - a time of rejoicing and celebrating. We have done the work of renewal and are now ready to celebrate the promise of a new year. We do this by eating or dwelling in a Sukkah – a temporary structure with a roof made of natural materials that provides more shade than sun but also allows enough of an opening to be able to see the stars. It reminds us that even in a dwelling place we maintain a connection to nature and God's creations. We acknowledge our vulnerabilities and rejoice in God's protecting shelter.

Rabbi Eliezer described the Sukkah as Ananei *Kavod*, clouds of glory. It is reminiscent of the cloud pillar representing God that followed the Israelites in the desert during the day. This guarded and guided them in their journeys.

As I reflect over the dramatic images of the remnants of both Hurricane Harvey and Hurricane Irma, with roofs torn off their foundations and some structures totally demolished. I am reminded of the Hebrew Chatimah that ends the Hashkeveinu prayer - ufros aleinu sukkat shlomecha - Eternal God, spread over us Your sukkah of peace. Cantor Debra Winston wrote a beautiful version of this prayer when her home was destroyed by a hurricane years ago. We sometimes sing it during Shabbat services.

O guide my steps and help me find my way; I need Your shelter now. Rock me in Your arms, and guide my steps. And help me make each day A song of praise to You. Rock me in Your arms and quide my steps. Ufros Aleinu Sukkat Shlomecha -Spread over us your Sukkah of peace.

This prayer is dedicated to all those that lost their homes in the recent hurricanes.

TUESDAYS:

1. Essays on Ethics: Weekly Reading of the Jewish Bible –
Tuesdays, 12 Noon – 1:15 PM Taught by: Rabbi Michele Medwin
[Course starts on October 17, 2017]

No religion has held a higher view of humanity than the Torah, which tells us we are each in the image and likeness of God. Yet, none has been more honest about the failings of even the greatest. God does not ask us to be perfect. He asks us, instead, to take the risks in pursuit of the right and the good, and to acknowledge the mistakes we will inevitably make. We will be using the book, Essays on Ethics: Weekly Reading of the Jewish Bible by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks to learn about the ethics taught in the Torah. This Fall we will concentrate on the book of Exodus, covering the following topics: On not obeying immoral orders, free will, telling the story, the face of evil, the structure of the good society, healing the heart of darkness, the labor of gratitude, the ethics of holiness, can there be compassion without justice, the spirit of community, integrity in public life.

2. One People Two Worlds: A Reform and an Orthodox Rabbi Explore the Issues that Divide Them – Tuesdays, 1:30-2:45 PM Taught by: Rabbi Medwin [Course starts on October 17, 2017]

After being introduced by a mutual friend, these two rabbis embarked on an unprecedented 18-month e-mail correspondence on the fundamental principals of Jewish faith and practice. What results is an honest, intelligent, no-holds-barred discussion of issues on which Reform and Orthodox differ including the existence of a Supreme Being, the origins and authenticity of the Bible, and the Oral Law, the role of women, assimilation, the value of secular culture, and Israel. Learn about these differences and where you fit in personally with your own beliefs. We will be using the book, One People Two Worlds, by Ammiel Hirsch and Yosef Reinman. (There are several used hard cover books in good condition on Amazon.com or in paperback from Amazon or Barnes and Noble.)

THURSDAYS:

3. Beginner Hebrew - No experience necessary -- Thursdays, 12:15 PM Taught by: Lauren Miller [Course starts October 5, 2017]

Students will learn the Hebrew letters, words and some blessings. There is a book for this class that the student purchases.

4. Adult Hebrew Level 2 -- Thursdays, 1: 45 PM Taught by: Lauren Miller [Course starts October 5, 2017]

This is a continuation of Level 1 for those who know the Hebrew alphabet and can read individual words and blessings and some longer prayers. There is a book for this class that the student purchases.




