## **Purim**

Purim is celebrated with a public reading—usually in the synagogue—of the Book of Esther (*Megillat Esther*), which tells the story of the holiday. Under the rule of King Ahashverosh, Haman, the king's prime minister, plots to exterminate all of the Jews of Persia. His plan is foiled by Queen Esther and her cousin Mordechai, who ultimately save the Jews of Persia from destruction. The reading of the *megillah* typically is a rowdy affair, punctuated by booing and noise-making when Haman's name is read aloud.

Purim is an unusual holiday in many respects. First, Esther is the only biblical book in which God is not mentioned. Second, Purim, like Hanukkah, traditionally is viewed as a minor festival, but elevated to a major holiday as a result of the Jewish historical experience. Over the centuries, Haman became the embodiment of every anti-Semite in every land where Jews were oppressed. The significance of Purim lies not so much in how it began, but in what it has become: a thankful and joyous affirmation of Jewish survival against all odds.



In the Book of Esther, we read that Purim is a time for "feasting and merrymaking," as well as for "sending gifts to one another and presents to the poor" (Esther 9:22). In addition to reading the *M'gillah* (Book of Esther), celebrants dress in costumes, have festive parties, perform "Purim-spiels," silly theatrical adaptations of the story of the *M'gillah*, send baskets of food (*mishloach manot*) to friends, and give gifts to the poor (*matanot l'evyonim*).



Hamantaschen: Yiddish for Haman's pockets, hamantaschen are three-cornered pastries filled with poppy seeds (*mohn* in Yiddish), fruit preserves, chocolate, or other ingredients that are traditionally eaten on Purim. In Israel during the weeks leading up to Purim, the aroma of freshly baked hamantaschen can be smelled on every block. Their triangular shape is thought to be be reminiscent of Haman's hat or ears.

Costumes: As part of the carnival-like atmosphere of Purim, many children and adults wear costumes. Some attribute this tradition to the fact that Esther initially "masked" her Jewish identity. Now a vibrant and widely practiced custom, some choose to dress as characters from the Purim story, while others select Jewish heroes from throughout history.

**Mishloach manot**: Jewish families make *mishloach manot* baskets at home and distribute them to friends. Most *mishloach manot* include hamantaschen but may also include a wide variety of foods and treats. These gifts are frequently referred to by their Yiddish name, *shalachmanos*.

Matanot l'evyonim: Gifts are given at this season to those in need so that they, too, can celebrate Purim with a special meal. Many families have committed to participating in this important social justice aspect of the holiday.

 Essays on Ethics: Weekly Reading of the Jewish Bible - Taught by Rabbi Medwin Tuesdays, Noon-1:15 PM We continue where we left off last semester. No previous experience is necessary. Even if you were not present for the Fall semester, you will be able to follow along.

No religion has held a higher view of humanity than the Torah, which tells us we are each in the image and likeness of God. Yet, none has been more honest about the failings of even the greatest. God does not ask us to be perfect. He asks us, instead, to take the risks in pursuit of the right and the good, and to acknowledge the mistakes we will inevitably make. We will be using the book, *Essays on Ethics: Weekly Reading of the Jewish Bible* by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks to learn about the ethics taught in the Torah. This fall we will concentrate on the book of Exodus, covering the following topics: on not obeying immoral orders, free will, telling the story, the face of evil, the structure of the good society, healing the heart of darkness, the labor of gratitude, the ethics of holiness, can there be compassion without justice, the spirit of community, integrity in public life.

2. One People Two Worlds: A Reform and an Orthodox Rabbi Explore the Issues that Divide Them - Taught by Rabbi Medwin

**Tuesdays, 1:30-2:45 PM** We continue where we left off last semester. No previous experience is necessary. Even if you were not present for the Fall semester, you will be able to follow along.

After being introduced by a mutual friend, these two rabbis embarked on an unprecedented 18-month e-mail correspondence on the fundamental principals of Jewish faith and practice. What results is an honest, intelligent, no-holds-barred discussion of issues on which Reform and Orthodox differ including the existence of a Supreme Being, the origins and authenticity of the Bible, and the Oral Law, the role of women, assimilation, the value of secular culture, and Israel. Learn about these differences and where you fit in personally with your own beliefs. We will be using the book, *One People Two Worlds*, by Ammiel Hirsch and Yosef Reinman. (There are several used hard-back books in good condition on Amazon.com or in paperback from Amazon or Barnes and Noble.)



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
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
