From: the Rabbi...

**Passover
Yom HaShoah
Yom HaZikaron
Yom HaAtzma'ut**

This year, the month of April contains four Jewish holidays. The first is Passover, which reminds us that we once were slaves and that God brought us from slavery to freedom. It is a holiday, whose message is hope, that has stayed with us and helped us survive other difficult times in our history. When we remember that we once were slaves and then were redeemed, it gives us eternal hope that redemption is always possible.

The next day of commemoration is Yom HaShoah – Holocaust Remembrance Day. It follows a week after the end of Passover. This day was picked for Yom HaShoah because it was the beginning of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising. Perhaps the Jews of Warsaw were inspired by the message of freedom they celebrated just two weeks earlier. After our liberation from the concentration camps, we worked toward creating a homeland for the Jews where we would be in control of our destiny.

In the United States, Memorial Day is separated from Independence Day by over a month. They have no real connection, other than both often give us long weekends. In Israel, they occur back to back. Yom HaZikaron, Israel Memorial Day, which follows a week later, reminds us that it is because of those who gave their lives that the country of Israel was born. In Israel, the flags are flown at half-mast starting at sundown. The next day there are memorial services and programs all over the country. And then.....this time at sundown, the flags are raised and Israelis turn from mourners to celebrators. We Jews know how to mourn AND how to celebrate and know that based on our history, the two are inextricably linked. Our appreciation of freedom is heightened by our experiences of oppression.

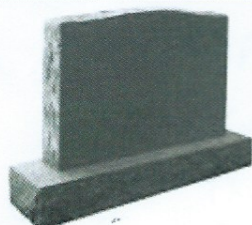

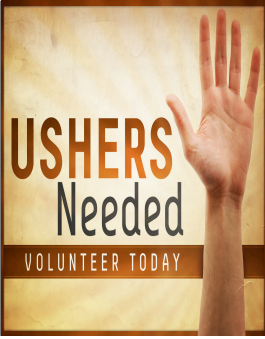
