

Ruth – The First Voluntary Jew

The five Megilot (stories written on a scroll) are associated with various Jewish holidays. most well-known Megilah is the book of Esther read on Purim. On Shavuot Shabbat, Friday, May 18, we will be reading from the book of Ruth. Shavuot is considered the holiday that celebrates receiving the Torah at Mt. Sinai. It is traditional to read the Ten Commandments on Shavuot. We also read from the book of Ruth because Ruth represents the first known person to voluntarily connect herself with the Jewish people, to voluntarily accept the Ten Commandments. She chose to return to Israel with her mother-in-law rather than stay with her own people. (Until then we read of the Patriarchs and Matriarchs and their biological descendants.)

On Shavuot Shabbat I would like to honor all those, who like Ruth, chose to voluntarily convert to Judaism and join our people. We are blessed to have you as part of our family. It would be most appropriate for Jews by Choice to read the story of Ruth that night at Shabbat Services.
