June is a quiet month, so let's look at what's special about the Hebrew month of Sivan

The central event to take place in the month of Sivan is God giving the Torah to the Jews at Mount Sinai.

Sivan is the third month of the Hebrew calendar if we begin our count from Nissan, the month of our liberation from Egypt, which is the way months are counted in the Torah.

Three is a portentous number in Judaism: Moses was the third child in his family, the Israelites began the three-day process of preparing themselves to receive the Torah on the third of Sivan, God divided the Jews into three groups with different roles: the Kohanim, the Leviites, and the rest of the Jews, Yisrael.

The Maharal (the famous renaissance-era Kabbalist) tells us to imagine a link chain. When you hold it up, the first link touches the second one. The second one touches both the first link and the third one. The third one touches the second one and not the first. Thus the third link is the first in the series that doesn't have any connection to the first link. The number three thus symbolizes something new, but not disconnected. Thus, for example, Moses, the third child in his family, was connected to the heritage of monotheism that Abraham initiated, but he took it a step further, giving his people a sense of nationhood based on the Torah.

The month of Sivan is connected historically to Nissan, the month of liberation. In Sivan, however, the Jews went a step beyond physical freedom and became spiritually autonomous, defined only by the Torah, God's word. Connected but new. Part of the process, but also beyond it.

What Is The Rabbi's Discretionary Fund?

Temple Sholom has many functions. Our goal is to make Judaism come alive as we celebrate Shabbat and Jewish holidays, perform mitzvot, and carry out the ethics taught in the Torah. The temple has a budget for many of these objectives and goals. Sometimes funds are needed that are not specifically budgeted for.

Every synagogue has a "Rabbi's Discretionary Fund." This is set up for the rabbi to obtain funds to help carry out the mission of Judaism in ways that the board of the synagogue cannot. The funds in the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund are used for various purposes. One of the most important purposes is to help those in need. All of these expenditures are known only to the rabbi and the recipient to prevent people from feeling embarrassed about asking for help. I have written checks to buy food cards to give to those who do not have enough food to eat. I have also written checks to electric companies and landlords when someone comes to me having had unusual expenses and are about to have their electricity turned off or the rent is past due. I have sometimes helped to pay transportation costs so someone could get to a family funeral or visit a sick family member. The funds have helped to pay for holiday dinners at the temple for people who would not be able to come otherwise. When people are in need and come to me, I do my best to help them out.

The funds can also be used to help enhance a temple program of the rabbi's that is not specifically budgeted for. These funds have occasionally been used to purchase special curricula, films, or books used for temple programs.

Each year the Primetimers make a significant donation to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund, and I am eternally thankful for their support. But you can also make a donation. Some people make a donation to show appreciation for something the rabbi has done. Others make donations to the fund in honor of or in memory of a loved one. Please consider making a donation to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund. It is a way for you to do a mitzvah and at the same time help the rabbi do even more mitzvot because of your help.

1. ***Jewish Stories from Heaven and Earth: Inspiring Tales to Nourish the Heart and Soul*** – Taught by Rabbi Medwin — **Tuesdays, Noon-1:15 PM**

Classes start on Tuesday, June 26th, 2018. There are eight classes.

The selected stories for this book include tales that reflect both the glory and grief, the humor and pride of the Jewish people. These stories emerge out of the Jewish tradition but are also very human and universal. It includes stories from the famous and not so famous, capturing the best and worst of the Jewish experience. The stories are divided into the following categories: Simple Goodness, Hope and Endurance, Continuity and Tradition, Lessons Learned, Light Out of the Holocaust, Great Escapes, Words of the Wise, Providence, and Israel – Land of Miracles. We will be using the book of the same title as the course edited by Rabbi Dov Peretz Elkins, Jewish Lights Publishing.

2. ***Ten Paths to Judaism*** — Taught by Rabbi Medwin — **Tuesdays, 1:30-2:45 PM**

Classes start on Tuesday, June 26th, 2018. There are eight classes.

A curriculum designed by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. All background information will be available on line. Topics include: The Way of Identity- On Being a Jew; The Way of Prayer; The way of Study; The Way of Mitzvot; The Way of Tzedakah – Love as Justice; The Way of Chessed – Love as Compassion; The Way of Faith; The Way of Israel – The Jewish Land; The Way of Kiddush Hashem – The Jewish Task; The Way of Responsibility – The Jewish Future; Conclusion – Why I am a Jew. *Once you register for the class you will be given information on how to access the on-line information.*

Classes start on Thursday, June 28th, 2018. **There are five (5) classes.**

In this epic five-part series, Simon Schama presents the extraordinary story of the Jewish experience from ancient times to the present day. This is a story that is at once deeply historical and utterly contemporary, taking viewers on a journey from the Biblical past to tomorrow's front pages. At the heart of *The Story of the Jews* is a compelling argument about distinctiveness and difference, separation and isolation, tolerance and prejudice, but it is also a celebration of the ways in which Jewish thought, Jewish imagination, and Jewish achievement have transformed the world for us all. — *We will begin each session with the presentation of background information and then we will view a one-hour episode after which we will discuss what has been presented. All points of view are welcome.*
