From: the Rabbi...

The Month of Elul

August 11 starts the month of Elul in the Hebrew calendar. It is the month that precedes

the High Holy Days. Elul is a gift in that it gives us a month to start preparing for the important work of evaluating ourselves for the High Holy Days so that we can become better people.

The High Holy Days ask us to reflect on the concept of sin. Most of us are basically good people. We don't do many of the obvious sins. The Hebrew word for sin is "Chet." It can be envisioned as a target with our goals and aspirations in the center of the target. During the year, we may aim for these targets but we may miss them, either completely, or not get as close to the bullseve as we would like.

The challenge of the High Holy Days is to turn inward, and be brutally honest with who we are. We can ask, "What are the things that I want to change? Do I always treat people the way I want to? Am I always kind to myself? How do I interact with, and care for the world that God created? How do I respond to those in need? What am I proud of and what do I wish I had done differently?

We can think of our lives as a work in progress. What progress have we made? Have we digressed from where we would like to be as a person? The month of Elul is that chance to do a check in, to see where we have come from, and where we would like to go.


At Temple Sholom we have a wonderful opportunity three times a year to send *Holiday Greetings* to our temple friends and family through our newsletter, *The Harbinger*.






