What Jewish Rituals Haven't You Done Yet

During Yom Kippur we offer two types of confessionals, one short, and one long. We confess as a group to many sins including: stealing, violent acts, abusiveness, corruption, committing crimes, being immoral, lying, and deceitfulness. Knowing the members of Temple Sholom, I would imagine and hope that such confessions don't apply to you. But we do want to change and do some things differently for the New Year. What can we work on?

This year, if you don't have much work to do regarding the ethical and moral mitzvot, I challenge you to increase your ritual mitzvot. You might ask, "Why do ritual mitzvot? I am a Reform Jew." Over the years Reform Judaism has reclaimed some of the ritual mitzvot, perhaps interpreting them differently. We have learned that doing Jewish rituals helps us to connection to other Jews around the world, to Jews back in time including our own relatives, and to God, since God is the one who asks us to do these rituals.

So I propose that over the next year, you try to do a few Jewish rituals that you have never done or haven't done in a while. See if it doesn't deepen your commitment to Judaism, to other Jews, and to God. If you are not sure what to do, here are some ideas. Feel free to contact me if you have questions about what you would like to do. (<u>rabbimedwin@me.com</u> or 607-765-2895.)

JEWISH RITUALS:

For Shabbat

- Light Shabbat candles and say the blessings over wine and challah at home during Friday dinner. (Handout available at the temple)
- Come to Shabbat services.
- Do something different on Shabbat than you do the rest of the week to make it special.
- Do a Havdalah service at the end of Shabbat (contact Rabbi Medwin for a copy of the Havdalah service)

Say More Blessings (A handout of these blessings is available at the temple.)

- Say the Motzi before eating a meal.
- Say the Shema every night at bedtime and every morning when you wake up.
- Say the Modeh/Modah Ani prayer every morning thanking God for waking up.

- Get a copy of the morning blessings from a Jewish siddur and recite them every morning. (You can buy a copy of our Mishkan T'filah through the office.)
- Say the *Shehecheyanu* when doing something for the first time or for the first time in a while.

Holiday Rituals

- Eat a meal in the Sukkah.
- Attend a Passover seder.
- Refrain from eating bread and other *hametz* during the entire week of Passover.
- Attend the Tu B'shevat seder at temple.
- Hear the Megillah being read on Purim.
- Light Chanukah candles even if there are no children at home.

Study

- Read a Jewish book Judaism has so many areas of interest. Ask Rabbi Medwin for recommendations.
- Get a weekly e-mail about the Torah portion (Go to reformjudaism.org, then "Learning", then "Ten Minutes of Torah", on the right side click on "sign up for Ten Minutes of Torah.")
- Read an English copy of the Torah, or Tanakh (Torah, Prophets, and Writings) with or without commentary
- Listen to a Jewish podcast.
- Take a Jewish course with Rabbi Medwin, or online.
- Learn Hebrew.

Other Rituals

- Consider eating "Kosher Style." Avoid pork, and/ or shellfish, and/or mixing beef and dairy.
- Ritually wash your hands before a meal.
- If you are creative make your own Jewish ritual object such as candle sticks, Kiddush cup, Chanukah menorah, Jewish star, tallit, kippah.

Franz Rosenzweig (1886-1929) was a German-Jewish philosopher who as a young man actually considered converting out of Judaism. But his intellectual curiosity compelled him to at least do a proper examination of Judaism first. So he went to a synagogue on Yom Kippur and experienced a spiritual transformation. He went on to become a serious student of Judaism. It's told that when Rosenzweig was once asked, "Do you put on *tefillin*?" his answer was *not yet*. Not *no*, but "not yet."


THURSDAY:



- H. Prepared meal and clean up


These are only suggestions, you will know the skills you have!






