# From: the Rabbi...

From the most religious to the most secular, the one thing that almost all Jews do is attend a Passover Seder, either at their own home or

someone else's home. I have often had congregants share with me fond memories of their rituals and traditions they remember from their childhood seders.

While there are standard universal Passover customs and traditions, families often create their own traditions. The Passover seder is designed to educate, so we are encouraged to come up with creative ways to keep the attention of the kids, as well as the adults. One fond memory I have is my father pouring the wine for Elijah. After he opened the door he would have us look very closely into Elijah's cup and say, "If you look really closely you can notice the wine going down a little. That means Elijah is here." I did believe him and I was able to "see" the wine level dropping, even if just a bit.






