Mourning and Celebration

In the United States, Memorial Day is at the end of May. Independence Day does not occur until more than a month later. By the time we get to celebrate our independence as a country, remembering those who gave their lives for our independence is way in the past. The connection between the two is not emphasized. They are treated as two separate entities, two separate holidays.

Not so in Israel. As Jews, I believe one of the reasons we have survived is that we know how to truly memorialize and remember our dead. But in order to be able to go on, we also know how to move forward and celebrate life. Memorial Day (Yom HaZikaron) and Independence Day (Yom HaAtzmaut) are celebrated back to back. On the eve of Memorial Day the flags are lowered to half-staff. There are memorial services throughout the country honoring those who gave their lives so Israel could come to be and continue to exist. The next evening, 24 hours later, flags are raised to full height, and the Independence Day celebration begins.

This transition is very powerful. Living in Israel during my first year of rabbinical school we got to experience this first hand. As we celebrated Israel's independence, we were still very aware of those who gave their lives for Jews to have a home land. Yet, we also were aware that while we needed to mourn those who sacrificed their lives, we also knew that life goes on and we need to find ways to continue to celebrate all the good that we have. This can be a good lesson for each of us individually. As we experience the losses in our lives, we are challenged to search for the good also.






