From: the Rabbi...

A New Way to look at Pirkei Avot

Pirke Avot (also known as Ethics or Sayings of the Fathers) is a tractate of Mishnah that talks about the Torah's views on ethics and interpersonal relationships. Rabbi Shmuly Yanklowitz recently published a book titled *Pirkei Avot: A Social Justice Commentary.* There are many great lessons in his approach to reading the text. I would like to share one of them with you here. You will hear more about his teachings during the High Holy Days and I will be using his book for one of my fall Sholom University classes.

Pirke Avot 2:5 – Hillel said: Do not separate yourself from the community; do not believe in yourself until the day you die; do not judge your fellow until you have reached their place; do not say something inappropriate, for it will then be appropriated; and do not say, "When I am free I will study," for perhaps you will not find free time.

These are such obvious lessons, but we often don't think of them. It is so important to be part of a community. Temple Sholom can be that place for you. We are quick to judge others, but I learned through counseling to be curious rather than judgmental. Why is that person acting that way? Perhaps there is a good reason that we don't know about. We are living in a climate where hurtful and biting comments are tossed around like a volley ball, leaving us fearful and searching. Regarding waiting to find time, Rabbi Yanklowitz responds: "All too often, we hear people say they are waiting for the proper time to go out do something worthwhile nearly everyone says they're waiting until they're less busy. What should be the most important aspects of our lives ---family, spiritual growth, kindness, and learning - cannot be put on hold until later. Rather, we must live our priorities now. They cannot wait."

What have you been waiting to do? Now is a good time to begin.

MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING

Temple members must be in good standing regarding their past temple financial obligations to register your child for religious school. Religious school tuition must be **paid in full** for your child to attend class.

NOT MEMBERS OF TEMPLE SHOLOM - To families who would like to register their children in our religious school but are not yet ready to become members of Temple Sholom:

Our religious school was created to provide Jewish education for the children of our members. The cost of running the school is not covered by tuition alone and is supplemented by the temple members' dues and fundraisers. In the past families were required to be members of Temple Sholom to attend our religious school. We encourage you to become members so you can fully participate in and support our synagogue. If you are not ready to join, we would like to give you a chance to experience our wonderful school and some of our temple programs. **FOR ONE YEAR ONLY**, you may register your child in our school at the non-member tuition. After one year, we will ask you to join the temple in order for your child to continue in our religious school program. (To have a Bar/Bat Mitzvah ceremony here at Temple Sholom, a student must attend the Temple Sholom religious school for a minimum of three consecutive years but we prefer they attend from Kindergarten or 1st grade to get the most out of their Jewish education.)

SPECIAL CONSIDERATION (Available to temple members AND to non-members.)

For those families with financial concerns, there is a committee in place for families requesting "special assistance" to help cover the cost of temple membership. All information is kept confidential. Only the committee members will know which families have applied for special consideration. Applications for "special consideration" are available at the office. The Clifford Schwartz scholarship fund is available to cover the cost of 50% of tuition for students whose families are on special consideration. For any temple member family that has more than two children in our school, even if they are not on special consideration, the scholarship will also cover 50% of the cost of the third, fourth, etc. student's tuition after tuition for the first two children have been paid.

TO PARENTS OF BAR/BAT MITZVAH STUDENTS: The students will be learning prayers as part of religious school. There will be a **Bar/Bat Mitzvah fee of \$625** that is due six months before the Bar/Bat Mitzvah date. This is in addition to the yearly tuition. This fee covers private tutoring with Rabbi Medwin and other expenses associated with having a Bar/Bat Mitzvah at Temple Sholom on Saturday morning. The Bar/Bat Mitzvah fee and ALL other financial obligations to Temple Sholom must be paid in full, unless other arrangements are made, in order for the student to receive their Torah portion booklet. (Please do not hesitate to contact Rabbi Medwin or the office if there are financial issues so we can make arrangements with you.)






