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From the Rabbi...

Light and Optimism

There is a Talmudic debate between Hillel and Shammai as the Rabbis decided on the Chanukah ritual of lighting the Chanukah menorah. Shammai said that we should start with eight lights on the first night and decrease one light each subsequent night. His explanation was that the oil in the Eternal light, which the Chanukah lights represent, slowly diminished each day until the Jews were able to purify enough oil to keep the light burning.

Hillel said that since Chanukah takes place at the darkest time of the year, we should start with one light, and slowly add on additional light each night. This represents increasing light, increasing hope, and increasing joy. This is a prevalent theme throughout Judaism. Even in the darkest times, we focus on the positive and continue to hope.



This has been a dark year for us. As we come to the close of 2020, there is cause to find increasing light, hope, and joy in the coming year. Vaccines for COVID have shown to be very promising and should be available within six months. There is also a chance for new opportunity and optimism in our country as the new government changes focus from division and hatred to compassion, empathy, and kindness. There is hope that as this message is repeated over and over, Americans will start to hear it and incorporate it into their hearts, being able to respond more positively to each other.

As the new secular year of 2021 begins, let us prayer that the soul of our country will begin to heal, and so will we.

Chanukah candle lighting 101

One candle is added to the menorah each night. The first night, you light only the shamash (the one at a different height) and one Chanukah candle. By the eighth night, you light all of the candles.

Candles should be added to the menorah from right to left (like Hebrew writing). Light the shamash candle first, then recite the blessings while holding the candle. Do not light the other candles until the blessings are done!

Blessings over Candles

Lighting the Candles - After reciting the blessings, use the shamash to light the Chanukah candles from left to right (newest to oldest). Candles should be left burning until they go out on their own. They must burn for more than half an hour. Standard Chanukah candles burn for about an hour.

We kindle these lights because of the wondrous deliverance You performed for our ancestors. During these eight days of Chanukah, these lights are sacred; we are not to use them but only to behold them, so that their glow may rouse us to give thanks for Your wondrous acts of deliverance.

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


