"Wear a Mask"

The holiday of **Purim** falls at the end of February this year. Purim is a holiday in which we dress up and wear masks. We get the chance to pretend we are someone we are not. We hide behind the face of someone else as a way to let down our guard and have fun - feel more free.



This year we face a different experience wearing a mask. This time the mask is to help us preserve who we are, to help us survive under the threat of the Corona Virus. But it also tests us. Yes, the mask is uncomfortable. It pulls on our ears. It fogs up our glasses. But it shows that we care, not only about ourselves, but about others. Wearing a mask is as much about keeping ourselves safe, as it is keeping others around us safe. There are public service messages reminding us of this. "Wear a Mask. Save Lives." They don't call it a mitzvah, but it certainly is - *Pikuach Nefesh* – saving a life, ours and others. While it has been hard lately to find the good in humanity, let's not forget how much more goodness there is in the world than evil. Rather than hiding behind these masks, it showed who we truly are.

The book of Esther is one of the few books in the Tanakh that does not mention the name of God. According to Rabbi David Aaron, Purim represents a miracle which was greater than the miracle of Passover. "The ultimate revelation of God's oneness happens when God does not have to openly interfere. This is the meaning of *Megilat Esther* – the revelation of hiddenness."

Hidden within each of us is the potential to be God-like. As horrible as the pandemic has been, it has brought out or expanded the sometimes hidden sense of caring that is being shown by mask wearers, health care workers, and frontline workers.



Are Your Grandchildren Part of Your Covid Pod? Celebrate **PURIM** with them.

What can you do with your grandchildren in a pandemic that will entertain and teach them about Purim? In addition to reading the *Book of Esther* and baking hamantaschen, together with your grandchildren, watch the Shalom Sesame videos (https://reformjudaism.org/jewish-holidays/purim/celebrating-purim-shalom-sesame-costumes) to learn how Purim is (when Covid free) celebrated in Israel. Then try some of the activities recommended by Reform Jewish educators.

ACTIVITIES

Send in the clowns. Who doesn't like to dress up and make some friends and family giggle? One of the mitzvot of *Purim* is that it is to be joyful. Put on a silly fashion show with your grandkids, using only certain materials (i.e., recycled newspapers, parent's clothing, mismatched outfits). If you really want to get the creative juices flowing, ask them to dress up like other family members and try to guess who's who. This activity will bring out the goofy fashion designer in everyone!

Together with your grandchildren, read *The Purim Costume* by Penninah Schram. In this warm, contemporary tale, the complete story of Purim is framed by the experience of a modern-day child, Rebecca, who is tired of always dressing up as Queen Esther. Her mother suggests many other options, but none appeals to Rebecca. Finally, her mother suggests she dress up as Vashti. As Rebecca considers this unusual option and listens to the story of Purim at the spiel, she comes to realize just how important a character was Vashti.


