# From the rabbi: Sadness AND Celebration



Jews know how to mourn and Jews know how to celebrate. In Israel, about a week apart, Jews remember those who perished during the Holocaust (Yom HaShoah), and then a week later, celebrate Israel becoming a Jewish state, after 2000 years being governed by others (Yom Ha'atzmaut). We will be commemorating both these observances as part of our Shabbat worship.

The day before Independence Day, Israel also observes Yom *HaZikaron* – Memorial Day. Unlike in the United States, in which these two days are over a month apart, in Israel these two days are intricately linked. They celebrate their independence by first remembering all those who gave their lives so that the State of Israel could come to be and continue to exist. This is a very powerful moment. Since days begin and end at sundown, on the same calendar day, there is a day of mourning with ceremonies and observances, and then immediately at sundown, the flags go from half mast, to full height, and the celebration of Independence begins. We, as Jews, have survived because we have learned how to acknowledge the difficulties in our history, and then, one step at a time, keep going forward.

I hope that we, as Americans, can do the same. We have been through a difficult year. Our country has lost hundreds of thousands of people to COVID. One in four Americans knows someone who died from COVID. We also experienced a horrific threat to our democracy. As we approach our Independence Day, I hope that we, as a country, can reflect on the many losses of the year, but also move forward with joy, excitement, and celebration.

# While No Longer Required, Quarantine After Domestic Travel Is Still Advised as Added Precaution

Starting April 1, travelers will no longer be required to quarantine after entering New York from another U.S. State or U.S. Territory.

While no longer required, the NYS Department of Health still recommends quarantine after domestic travel as an added precaution. To beat this virus once and for all we all must continue doing what we know works to stop the spread, including wearing masks, washing our hands and practicing social distancing.


Regardless of quarantine status, all individuals exposed to COVID-19 must:

- Continue daily symptom monitoring through Day 14
- Continue strict adherence to all recommended non-pharmaceutical interventions, including hand hygiene and the use of face coverings, through Day 14 (even if fully vaccinated)
- Must immediately self-isolate if any symptoms develop, and contact the local public health authority or their healthcare provider to report this change in clinical status and determine if they should seek testing.


