From the rabbi:

**“Seeing your face is like
 seeing the face of God”**



Jacob had been estranged from his brother, Esau, for twenty years. When they met again for the first time, they didn't know what to expect. When Jacob saw his brother he cried, “Seeing your face is like seeing the face of God.” (*Gen. 33:10*)

On March 6, 2020, we gathered at Temple Sholom to celebrate Purim, not knowing that Shabbat would be the last time we would see each other in person until June 18, 2021.

As I stood before the congregation at our first in-person Shabbat service in our “temporary home,” I was overwhelmed with so many mixed emotions - excitement, joy, gratitude, relief, and also really feeling the trauma of all we went through during the past fifteen months. Seeing the faces of so many from the Temple Sholom family in person was like “seeing the face of God!” Hearing voices joined together in prayer was like hearing the voice of God.

We recited two special prayers together:

- *Shehecheyanu*, so grateful that we survived not only physically, but spiritually as we made it through the weeks and months together on Zoom.
- *Birkat Gomel*, a prayer to recite when one has been through a life threatening experience and survived.

The Torah ends with a description of Moses. “Never again did there arise in Israel a prophet like Moses – the only one who was able to truly know God “face-to-face.” (*Deut. 37:10*) At the June 18 service we got to feel a little like Moses as we reunited our physical and spiritual selves, “face-to-face,” all of us created in the image of God. Perhaps it was fate that we reunited on the 18th, the Jewish symbol of life!

**Sing unto God all the Earth a New Song:
An exploration of global Jewish music and poetry
Taught by Student Cantor Isaac Sonett-Assor
Fridays 10:00 -11:00 a.m. July 9 - 30, 2021**



Throughout the history of Judaism, Jews have made their worship more personal and heartfelt through contemporary artistic expression, reflecting the hopes and fears of the day. We invite you to join cantorial student Isaac Sonett-Assor for a four week course, in which we will explore music and poetry from Jewish communities from all over the world throughout history. How did Jews in different communities turn to the liturgy and the Bible to find inspiration and comfort during times of joy and struggle? And how might we find meaning in these creations in our own time? Please feel free to contact Isaac for more information at isaac.sonett.assor@gmail.com.

Session 1: Hebrew Poetry from Muslim and Christian Spain, 950-1492

We will learn about the history of the Jews in the medieval Iberian Peninsula, which was the largest Jewish community in all of Europe through the end of the 14th century. This community gave rise to generations of revolutionary poets who, through their interaction with Arabic culture and its literary tradition, expanded Hebrew verse beyond the biblical and liturgical domains. As poet Peter Cole writes: "Suddenly...Hebrew poets were writing with tremendous power about a wide range of subjects, including wine, war, friendship, erotic longing, wisdom, fate, grief, and both metaphysical and religious mystery."

2: Music throughout the Sephardi Diaspora, 1492-1912

At the end of the 15th century, the Jewish world would change forever as the Jews of Spain and Portugal were either exiled or forced to convert to Christianity. These refugees would relocate throughout the Americas, the Ottoman Empire, Africa, India, and even Indonesia and China. Some would remain in the Iberian Peninsula and practice their Judaism covertly. These Sephardi communities would develop a variety of distinct cultural identities and musical traditions, some of which we will explore together.

Session 3: European Encounters with Modernity, 1500s-1930s

We will turn to the Jewish communities of Western, Central, and Eastern Europe--the diverse array of enclaves known collectively as Ashkenazi Jewry. In the 18th century, the Jews of Europe increasingly came into contact with the ideas of the Enlightenment. Following the French Revolution, Jews were gradually afforded the opportunity to enter mainstream society. With this opportunity came the challenge of deciding how--if at all--to live a Jewish life in a complicated new world. Together, we will explore the music and poetry of the Hassidim, the early Reformers, and modernist Hebrew and Yiddish poets.

Session 4: A Global Jewish Community

For our final session, we will study compositions from some of the major centers of Jewish life in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries: North and South America and Israel. Just as Jewish music has always been an organic artform in conversation with the cultures in which it has flourished, the same principles hold true to this day. We will discuss the factors that drive the creation of contemporary Jewish music as well as how these compositions impact us. Does contemporary liturgical music adequately express the concerns of today's worshipper? What do we hope to find in today's Jewish music?
