From the rabbi:

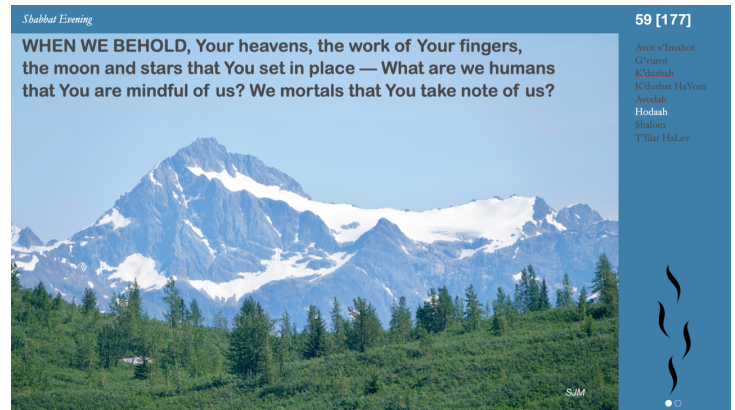
Creating the World of Visual T'filah



It was Friday morning, the day after Yom Kippur. Even though we were only on Zoom throughout the High Holy Days, I felt a sense of peace and contentment, and a strong connection to the Temple Sholom family. Without *mahzorim* (*High Holy Day Prayer Books*) in hand, we were able to truly pray as a community with our electronic devices. I was very tired after all the preparation leading up to the Holy Days, and after leading so many different types of services, but Shabbat comes every week, ready or not. I could have reused a previous Visual T'filah Shabbat service I had put together, but I had a strong need to create a new service. And then it dawned on me, creating a Visual T'filah service is a form of praying for me, in and of itself.

I start with a set of slides that have all the prayers from the prayerbook, which is available from the CCAR (The Reform rabbis national organization). I focus on the service as a whole and explore the feeling I want this service to convey. What is going on in the world around us? What inspiration can I glean from the Torah portion? Should the service be upbeat and celebratory or more contemplative and calming? What do we as a community need this particular Shabbat?

Then I focus in on one prayer at a time. What is this particular prayer saying to me today? I look through my collection of photographs and images to find the picture that best portrays that feeling. Then I search through my collection of music to find just the right melody to enhance the feeling of the prayer as it speaks to me. Or perhaps I have a video that better conveys the sense and emotion of the prayer. As I work on each prayer slide, finding the best way to arrange the words around the picture, the words of the prayer permeate my soul. I am praying as I create each slide.



Shabbat is about creation. In the Kiddush we read, "Zikaron l'masei Breishit - A reminder of the work of Creation." Made in the image of God, each Shabbat I create a prayer world.

Back to Basics: Torah Study from the Beginning

Tuesdays, Noon - 1:15 PM

October 12 – December 7, 2021

(No class November 2, 2021)

Continuing from where we left off in the summer semester (*Exodus Chapter 7*), we will read verse by verse and discuss the various ideas and concepts that come up. What are the messages we gain from the text? How does the verse speak to me personally? **You are welcome to bring any Torah commentary you have to add to the discussion. You do NOT need to have taken this class before. You will be able to follow along without any previous knowledge of Torah.**

American Jewish History

Tuesdays, 1:30 – 2:45 PM

October 12 – December 7, 2021

(No class November 2, 2021)

We start with World War I (Chapter 5) and explore the following: How did freedom of religion affect American Judaism and Jews ability to flourish or assimilate? In what ways did Judaism flourish and differ in America? What were the greatest influences on the American Jewish community? How important is Judaism to America? How did Judaism influence other Americans?

American Judaism is largely a result of adapting to a religious environment shaped by American Protestantism, the canons of free market competition, the ideals of freedom, and the reality of diversity. This will be the background to understand and explore such questions in this class. Using the book, *American Judaism: A History SECOND EDITION* by Jonathan Sarna, we will learn the dynamic story of people struggling to be Jewish and Americans. This is a story of people who lost their faith and then regained their faith, a story of assimilation but also a story of revitalization. The following topics from the book will be covered:




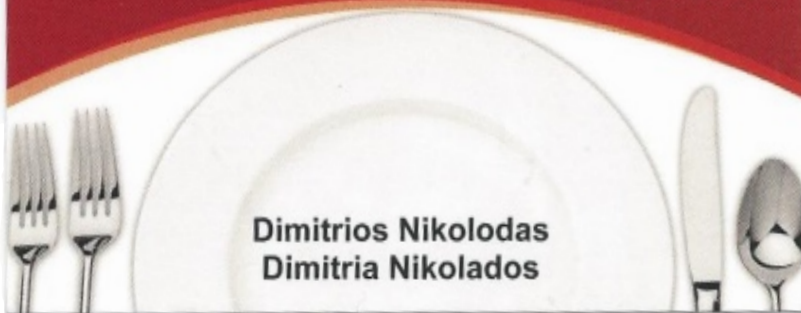
