#### From the rabbi:

#### The Passover Symbols in Our Lives



The table at a Passover seder is probably one of the most dramatic sights of the entire Jewish year, filled with colors and symbols of the holiday. It often brings back memories of years gone by, of families and friends getting together, sitting around a similarly set table. Regardless of what haggadah you use, the symbols on the table are universal. Even though these symbols were devised by the rabbis of the Talmudic period almost 2000 years ago, we can continue to gain personal meaning from the symbols for our lives today. Here are some ideas about how to make this year's Passover a more meaningful one.

HAGGADAH –Haggadah means "the telling." On Passover we tell the story of the Israelites exodus from Egypt, going from a people enslaved, to a free people ready to receive the laws that their community will embrace and commit to their children. It is the most important story of our people's history. It is so important, that even though the events happened over 3000 years ago, we continue to tell this story to our children, so they can tell the story to their children. What are the important stories in your family's history? Have you shared them with the next generation? Are they written down or recorded somewhere so the next generation can read about them?

MATZAH – The matzah represents time, or lack there of. When Pharaoh finally gave the Israelites permission to leave Egypt, they hurried to gather their belongings. They didn't have time to let the dough of the bread rise so the baked bread they took with them remained flat. What are the goals and wishes in our lives that are important to us, but we can't seem to find the time to make them happen? What is "flat" in our lives that if we gave it more attention, we could add fullness to? Use this Passover season to find the time for the things we want or should do, but keep putting off.

MAROR/BITTER HERBS - We have horseradish on the table to remind us of the bitterness of slavery that the Israelites endured. Throughout our lives we encounter personal moments of bitterness, for ourselves, our families, and our friends. Our lives don't always go the way we would like them to. The Passover story reminds us that even when times appear to be at their lowest, there is hope for redemption, for finding a way for the waters to part, so we can get to the other side toward a new future. That is why we sing Mi Chamocha at every service. That is the prayer the Israelites sang when they crossed the Reed Sea. Use the Passover story to help put your sorrows and challenges in perspective. Can you find reasons for hope, to help you get through the bad times?

**CHAROSET** – The chopped fruits, nuts and wine mixture is made to look like mortar. It is to remind us of the bricks the Israelites were forced to make while they were slaves. Yet, one of the most important ingredients is sugar or honey. At the seder, we add the *charoset* to the bitter herbs and make a Hillel sandwich, echoing the message that even with bitterness, we can find ways to sweeten our lives.

**PARSLEY** – The bright greens on the table contrast with the white of the matzah. It is a reminder that the winter has passed and spring is upon us. Even though we live in the Catskills, and spring comes a little later, we can still fill our surroundings with colorful plants, flowers and decorations inside our homes, even before the leaves and flowers start blooming outside.

One thing you can do is sign up with Delaware River Solar (DRS) to get your electricity from a solar field nearby. By signing up, you will save 5-10% on your bill, monthly. Additionally, you will receive a \$100 Visa Gift card and **Temple Sholom will get the gift card** as well.



Needless to say, this is a no brainer! Good for you, good for Temple Sholom, and great for the environment and jobs in Sullivan County. This program does not require solar panels on your property and applies to homeowners, renters and businesses.

The temple is in the process of getting this same community solar program and is looking forward to having many members of the congregation doing the same since it is a fundraiser as well.
