## From the rabbi:

### Twenty-Five Years



My son, Dan, had his Bar Mitzvah service on October 24, 1992. His Torah portion was Bereishit and occurred just after the High Holy Days. I was asked to read Torah for Yom Kippur that year at my congregation in Wilmington, DE. I remember looking up from the Torah after I finished reading and looked out at everyone sitting in the pews. I started thinking, "This is what I should be doing." Shortly after that, I was talking to the assistant rabbi in her office. Steve was there with us. We started talking about "mid-life" crises and I confessed, that my mid-life crisis was that I wanted to be a rabbi. She looked at me very seriously and said, "Then we will find a way to do that." While I was not sure, Steve told me later on, he knew at that moment it was a done deal.

Four and a half years later, I stood on the Bima at Temple Emanuel in New York City, after living in Jerusalem for a year, and commuting to HUC in NYC from Wilmington, DE, for three more years, being ordained as a rabbi. My journey as a rabbi has taken me to Temple Sholom, in Broomall, PA, to Temple Concord in Binghamton, NY, and finally to Temple Sholom in Monticello, where I have been your rabbi for seventeen years. In addition, I worked as a chaplain at the Family

School in Hancock, NY, and returned to HUC to receive my D.Min. degree and a mental health counseling license.

On Thursday, May 5, I will be returning to Temple Emanuel to receive an honorary degree, Doctor of Divinity. This is given to HUC graduates who have served the Jewish community for twenty-five years. It is fitting that as I celebrate twenty-five years as a rabbi, I am also preparing to retire. It is a nice way to finish my career in the rabbinate. The years have been challenging at times but most often rewarding. I am blessed to have met so many wonderful people along the way who share my love of Judaism. I feel blessed to have been given the opportunity to help people feel closer to Judaism and feel closer to God. I thank you for all you have done to help make Temple Sholom the special place that it is.

But it is time to rest. I have given so much of myself over the years and I am tired. My family has sacrificed as I have worked on every Jewish holiday, a time when most other Jewish families spend time together. It is time to give to myself and my family now. It is time to return to being a "Jew in the pews."

The last Shabbat service that I will lead is June 24. I hope to see you again between now and then, or perhaps on August 7, when we celebrate my retirement together.



## **Rabbinical Services Set for the Coming Year**

Rabbi Medwin's retirement created a void that seemed impossible to fill. Rabbi Medwin possesses creative talent that produced extraordinary Zoom services that cemented the congregation together during the Covid pandemic. Aside from that, the pandemic depressed rabbinical school enrollment, resulting in a nationwide shortage of rabbis. And there were additional constraints imposed by budget and our out-of-the-way location.

#### Our Musical Future

For months the Rabbi Search Committee despaired of finding a replacement. But ultimately the Committee succeeded magnificently, identifying a young musical couple who will conduct Shabbat services for the temple, both in person and by Zoom. Services will be different from what we are used to, but they are sure to be uplifting.



On April 19, the Board approved the appointment of Ira Levin and his wife Julia to lead services three Fridays a month. Ira Levin is a cantorial soloist who has led services with Jewish songs and prayers for 20 years in many congregations, including Congregation Beth El (South Orange, NJ), Agudas Achim (Livingston Manor, NY), Union Temple (Brooklyn, NY), Peninsula Temple Shalom (Burlingame, CA), Temple Emanu-El (San Francisco, CA). In addition, he has been a Jewish song leader for many JCCs, camps, and festivals.

A tenor and instrumentalist, Ira Levin is often accompanied by his wife Julia, a trained soprano. They have produced several albums

Having settled on this talented couple, the Rabbi Search Committee was still faced with a dilemma. The Levins were already booked for the High Holy Days. In another stroke of luck, yet another

young singing couple came our way – Rabbi Joshua Gray and his wife Meghan. Rabbi Gray is an independent rabbi, ordained just a year ago. A classically trained singer, he currently leads services as a cantorial soloist for Temple Beth El/Congregation Shaaray T'filah in Glens Falls, New York. He also teaches Judaic Studies, Hebrew, and Tanach in their religious school. A practicing clinical psychologist and high-level administrator, Rabbi Gray got his psychology degree Summa Cum Laude from the Pennsylvania State University.

One thing you can do is sign up with Delaware River Solar (DRS) to get your electricity from a solar field nearby. By signing up, you will save 5-10% on your bill, monthly. Additionally, you will receive a \$100 Visa Gift card and **Temple Sholom will get the gift card** as well

Needless to say, this is a no brainer! Good for you, good for Temple Sholom, and great for the environment and jobs in Sullivan County. This program does not require solar panels on your property and applies to homeowners, renters and businesses.

The temple is in the process of getting this same community solar program and is looking forward to having many members of the congregation doing the same since it is a fundraiser as well.






