From the rabbi:

Modah Ani



Giving thanks is a strong Jewish tradition. From sacrifices in the wilderness and at the Temple in Jerusalem, to reciting prayers instead of sacrifices after the destruction of the Temple, we have always found ways to appreciate what God has given us.

Each morning, Jewish tradition invites us to offer a prayer of thanksgiving, *Modeh Ani*. It is the most important thing we can thank God for. As we wake up, we recite, "I thank you God for returning my soul to me." In other words - thank God that I lived to see another day. The *Modeh Ani* prayer is in the singular. (Women say *Modah Ani*.) It invites us to ask, "What am <u>I</u> personally grateful for?"

There is also a prayer for thanksgiving in every worship service, Modim anachnu lach. We thank You, God, for our lives which are in Your hand, for our souls which are in Your care, for Your miracles that we experience every day... The Modim prayer is plural. What are we grateful for as a community?

It is said that every rabbi has three or four messages that are the basis of all their sermons and teachings. One of mine is, "No matter how bad things may seem, there is always something you can find to be grateful for." By doing this, we can face each day with joy, rather than only sorrow. We find time at each Shabbat service, to reflect on the past week and recall what we are






PLANT SALE NEEDS NEW CHAIRPERSON


Our annual card and Mah Jongg party will be on Monday, August 1. This is always a wonderful event for the benefit of Temple Sholom.




