THE BEDTIME SHEMA: TRANSFORMING SLEEP INTO A DAILY SPIRITUAL PRACTICE

Tuesdays at 1:30 starting August 9, 2022

"Forgiveness" is a major theme of Jewish practice. That focus intensifies on the High Holy Days, but rabbinic Judaism also provides us with a **nightly** forgiveness practice. The energy of forgiveness, especially before we go into rejuvenating and healing sleep, is powerful.

But how? Traditionally speaking, we just need to let go of the ego and the anger. The tool is right there...connect with God...get out of our own way...and do the Bedtime Shema every single night. The power of forgiveness, true forgiveness, will set us free...So release the chains, flee from Egypt and run to the Promised Land. All through forgiveness.

But how?! Together, we'll explore this practice and its promises.

Electric charges are going through the roof in Sullivan County.

One thing you can do is sign up with Delaware River Solar (DRS) to get your electricity from a solar field nearby. By signing up, you will save 5-10% on your bill, monthly. Additionally, you will receive a \$100 Visa Gift card and Temple Sholom will get the gift card as well.

Needless to say, this is a no brainer! Good for you, good for Temple Sholom, and great for the environment and jobs in Sullivan County. This program does not require solar panels on your property and applies to homeowners, renters and businesses.

The temple is in the process of getting this same community solar program and is looking forward to having many members of the congregation doing the same since it is a fundraiser as well.


