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

The Ritual Committee has moved into high gear. Headed by Ira Simon, the team has been meeting almost weekly via Zoom, and they have accomplished a lot.

As you can see on page 1, the Committee has finalized the High Holy Day worship schedule. Ira has coordinated the schedule with Rabbi Josh Gray, who has graciously given

his time for meetings and helped to select the Torah readings for the various services. He has put in many hours creating slides for the Visual Tefilah.



Ellen Nesin has helped to coordinate and schedule the honors, made many phone calls, and written letters to congregants regarding the Yizkor booklet, memorial wall, and honors. Her daughter, Jessica Nesin Liston, will be recording piano accompaniment for many of the prayers. Ellen reminds us that responses to those letters must be back to her by September 20.

Lauren Miller is partnering with Ellen in assigning honors and readings, and she would still appreciate volunteers to read in both English and Hebrew (especially Hebrew). She is also organizing volunteers to greet and usher, set up, check vaccination status, assure that participants are in attendance when they are called, and run the elevator for the six scheduled services.

Jane Jacobs has already installed a pictorial memorial, which is once again mounted on the wall near the back of the sanctuary. If you'd like to pay your respects to a loved one in this way, send Jane a picture and a tribute typed on a 3 x 5" card, or put the card in the envelope next to the wall.

Gail Abramowitz and Ruth Turk have contributed valuable insights on new High Holiday protocols, such as how to participate via Zoom, electronic ticket distribution, and (especially) covid protocols such as N95 mask recommendations.

All this is in addition to the ongoing work of the Ritual Committee coordinating with Julia and Ira Levin (cantorial leaders), Ira Simon (officiant), and Michael Zalkin (tech mavin) to secure leadership and technical wizardry for Shabbat services.

The Building Committee has also been busy. An outstanding accomplishment, spearheaded by Rick Stein and Don Horowitz, was to work with Michael Feinstein who secured generous donors to fix our decrepit sidewalk. However, this is a very expensive undertaking, and additional funding is still needed to close the gap.

The Building Committee has also brought in professionals to upgrade our plumbing and wiring and bring it up to code. And, of course, they keep up with routine repairs.

Did you have any idea so much was going on behind the scenes? With volunteers like this, we are poised for another successful year.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish you a joyful Rosh Hashanah and to remind you to get down to your local farmers market to buy some honey and apples!

TWO VERY SPECIAL TORAH SCROLLS

Temple Sholom has the privilege of housing two Holocaust Torah scrolls under its roof. This is an unusual honor as so few Torahs were rescued after the destruction of World War II. Surviving Holocaust scrolls are lent to synagogues over the world by a dedicated organization, The Memorial Scrolls Trust in London, England.

The recovered Torah scrolls at Temple Sholom belonged to the Czech communities of Bohemia and Moravia. They made their arduous journey from Prague to London where they were restored so they could find their rightful place in Jewish life.

In 1941 the Jewish population of these two Czech protectorates was about 92,000. In 1945 it had been reduced to about 7800. The synagogues were destroyed, along with many religious books and scrolls. Some of these were later found buried and hidden in walls by the Jews who tried to save them as Hitler's forces advanced. Most of those Jews perished in Terezin, a concentration camp 30 miles north of Prague. Each remaining Czech scroll represents a lost synagogue and thousands of lost lives.

How Did They End Up in Monticello?



This is one of two heritage Torah scrolls entrusted to Temple Sholom by The Memorial Scrolls Trust in London. These scrolls belonged to the communities of Bohemia and Moravia and were restored after an arduous journey from Prague to London. If you would like to donate towards the preservation of scrolls rescued after the Holocaust, Temple Sholom will make sure that your donation gets to The Memorial Scrolls Trust.

After the war, many precious items were found and brought to The Jewish Museum in Prague. The Michle Synagogue outside Prague became a warehouse where the scrolls in various states of damage were poorly stored. With the aid of British rabbis and tedious negotiations, the scrolls were purchased for \$30,000 through Westminister Synagogue and Kent House in London.

Blood-stained, burned, and damaged, these scrolls arrived in London in 1962, and the work of restoration began. By Jewish law, all work must be done by hand by skilled scribes using special ink. The Memorial Scrolls Trust took on this task.

Some scrolls were so damaged that they could not be restored to a condition in which they could be considered "kosher," and therefore permitted to be used ritually under Jewish Law. Nevertheless, both kosher and non-kosher scrolls -- perfect and with errors -- are now on long-term loan to Jewish institutions around the world.

Forty years ago a new rabbi at Temple Sholom, Rabbi Robert Shenkerman, on his very first day at the temple, made the discovery that the temple's Torah scrolls and other items from the sanctuary had been stolen. Funds were very limited, so Rabbi Shenkerman wrote to request the loan of a Holocaust scroll.

The arrival and dedication of the scroll from Pisek, Bohemia, took place on June 4, 1982 -- 40 years ago. This scroll is well over 100 years old, and the temple uses it only on special occasions.

Temple Sholom obtained the names of the original Czech congregants from the Prague Museum. These names are now on a plaque on the wall in Temple Sholom's sanctuary. During the course of each year, the congregation recites yahrzeit – a memorial prayer -- for each person who died in the Terezin death camp.

Temple Sholom Received a Second Holocaust Scroll

Temple Sholom currently has two Holocaust Torah scrolls. The second scroll was actually stored for years in a garage by a woman that took it home from the abandoned Crescent Hill Synagogue in Rock Hill. It remained in her garage until she notified The Memorial Scrolls Trust. The Trust then turned to nearby Temple Sholom, asking for storage space. Congregant Anne Palley volunteered to be present at the temple to receive the scroll. She had guessed it would be a small item that she could put in the ark

and go on her way. To her surprise, a truck arrived with two men to transfer into the temple a 200-year-old sacred item in a heavy display case.

Anne stood before it in awe. She felt honored to be the receiver of this very special scroll. "It's been burned, water damaged, and recovered," said Anne. "It survived the Holocaust and found its way here. I hope we will have the honor of displaying it for many years to

come. It's a sacred trust to remind us of the evil that must never happen again." Anne has taken on the responsibility of raising funds that will be used to restore and care for the Holocaust scrolls.

Donation checks that are earmarked for this purpose may be sent to Temple Sholom with the memo "Memorial Scrolls Trust." The temple also offers to say kaddish for any Holocaust victims that members of the community would like to memorialize.
