We seem to have hit the jackpot with music this year. For the second time, we have been blessed with a terrific cantorial duo who are leading us through the High Holidays. And Jessica Nesin Liston, who has been our accompanist for many High Holidays past, will be joining us virtually via Zoom.

It is wonderful that so many of our members accepted honors during the High Holidays – it's great to hear from them, both live and on Zoom. For those of you who will shortly be leaving for warmer climes, we hope to continue to see you on Zoom and wish you the best for the coming year.



Autumn is one of our favorite seasons. The richness of the leaves colorful turning and scents in the air bringing us into the fullness of the cycle of the earth, remind us to be present, to savor what is before us!

We are so grateful for the loving bond we have already been granted, getting to serve and be a part of this wondrous community. You inspire us in your dedication, not only to services and the temple but to one another. The classes, the trips, the concerts and all the extra curricular events that not only raise money for the shul, but strengthen the bonds and the fullness of life this community offers.

It's been a privilege to get to savor this first string of "firsts" with you. We had our first baby naming ceremony, our first Selichot service, which many of you joined on the bus ride home from Virginia. We are overjoyed anticipating our first Sukkot and Simchat Torah celebrations together.

This passage from Yitzhak Buxbaum's *Jewish Tales of Mystic Joy* points out the through line of this sacred series we have entered into :

"The holidays at this time of year are actually all connected to each other. First, comes Selichot, which leads into Rosh HaShanah and the Ten Days of Repentance, and they lead into Yom Kippur. After Yom Kippur comes Sukkot, the "Season of our rejoicing," and finally, the chain of holidays concludes with Simchat Torah, when we celebrate and dance with God's Torah. Why is Simchat Torah the culmination of all the holidays? Because joy is the highest worship there is...."

It is sincerely a tremendous joy to have the honor of being with you all and we look forward to many more firsts and returning simchas together.

Sukkot is one of the most joyful festivals on the Jewish calendar. "Sukkot," a Hebrew word meaning "booths" or "huts," refers to the Jewish festival of giving thanks for the fall harvest. The holiday has also come to commemorate the 40 years of Jewish wandering in the desert after the giving of the Torah atop Mt. Sinai.

Also called Z'man Simchateinu (Season of Our Rejoicing), Sukkot is the only festival associated with an explicit commandment to rejoice. Sukkot is celebrated five days after Yom Kippur on the 15th of the Hebrew month of Tishrei, and is marked by several distinct traditions. One, which takes the commandment to dwell in booths literally, is to erect a *sukkah*, a small, temporary booth or hut. Sukkot (in this case, the plural of *sukkah*) are commonly used during the seven-day festival for eating, entertaining and even for sleeping.

Our sukkot have open walls and open doors, and this encourages us to welcome as many people as we can. We invite family, friends, neighbors, and community to rejoice, eat, and share what we have with each other.

Another name for Sukkot is *Chag HaAsif* (Festival of the Ingathering), representing the importance in Jewish life of giving thanks for the bounty of the earth.


