From the President

The ritual Committee can take credit for coordinating with Rabbi Josh and making the week run smoothly, so thank you to Ira Simon, Lauren Miller, Gail Abramowitz, Ruth Turk, Ellen Nesin, and Jane Jacobs for a job well done.

Like its members, our building has been showing its age, and we are well aware that aches and pains come with costs. Big expenditures have cropped up for upgrading the electrical system, fixing the sidewalk (*see page 1*), and fixing the leaky roof.

We are fortunate that Ellen Nesin has taken on the responsibilities of Treasurer. She has succeeded in getting our financials on to her computer and bringing them up to date — not an easy task since our accounting program is a dinosaur from 2012. I won't bore you with the details. The good news is that, owing to the generosity and support of our members, Ellen reports that we will be able to cover the big upcoming expenditures.



Have you been following the controversy about carrying guns in religious buildings? In June the Supreme Court struck down New York's strict concealed carry laws. Governor Kathy Hochul countered in July by signing into law the Concealed Carry Improvement Act. This new law added checks on gun

ownership in New York State, strengthened eligibility requirements, and prohibited concealed carry permit holders from bringing firearms into sensitive locations such as bars, libraries, schools, government buildings, hospitals, AND houses of worship.

Thereupon, the New York State Jewish Gun Club filed suit against New York Attorney General Letitia James

and New York City Police Department Commissioner Keechant Sewell, alleging that, "This law specifically targets religious people by threatening them with arrest and felony prosecution if they carry their firearm while engaging in religious observance."

In early October a Federal judge temporarily blocked enforcement of some parts of New York's gun law, including many restrictions related to "sensitive locations," but let stand most of those involving places of worship and religious observation. You can find articles about this at these links:


