Holiday festivities are in full swing all around Sullivan County. Students in my grandson's class at Benjamin Cosor Elementary School each brought in an ethnic dish to share for their pre-Thanksgiving lunch. My grandson insisted upon bringing chicken soup with matzoh balls. I told him that blintzes or latkes would be easier to handle since the kids were eating in the hallway, but no, it had to be chicken soup with matzoh balls. The spread featured multiple versions of arepas, several rice and bean dishes, fried plantains, mac & cheese, injera bread, and a couple of banana bread puddings, among other delicacies. Nobody else brought matzoh ball soup. Fifty matzoh balls later (while keeping the soup warm in a 25-cup coffee maker), it was a big hit!

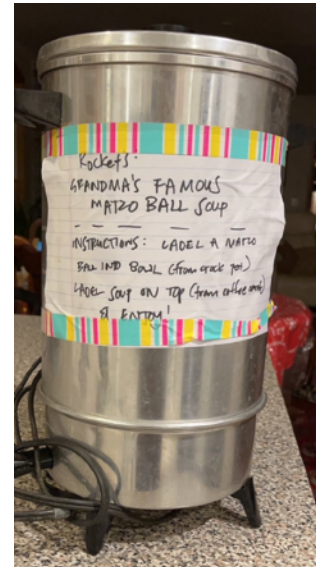
Here's my chicken soup recipe (quantities are arbitrary):

Fill a big pot with soup chicken (backs, necks, feet, a rooster or stewing hen if you can get one) and add water to cover. Add carrot slices, celery pieces, cut-up parsnip (very important to give the soup robustness), a large sliced onion, generous amounts of parsley & dill, at least a tablespoon of salt, a bay leaf (optional), and pepper. Boil gently for three hours. If the soup isn't quite savory enough, add a tablespoon or two of Osem Consommé. (This last ingredient is a secret, so don't tell anybody.) Let it cool and remove the chicken. Throw out the skin and bones and put a little of the shredded chicken back into the soup. The rest will make great sandwiches.

Keeping her beloved congregation in mind, Rabbi Medwin has suggested an online Torah study opportunity.



Rabbi Micah Streiffer offers both a beginner and an advanced class at affordable fees.

The recommended monthly contribution for this program is \$36 per month. However, no one is turned away for financial reasons — participants may simply choose to enter a different amount. The first month is a \$1 trial so you can check things out. That gives you four weeks to decide whether the group is right for you.

I attended the first class and it was a similar format to our past classes with Rabbi Medwin.

This is an opportunity to connect with people from all over the U.S. and Canada.

Chanukah Blessings

Candles are added to the *hanukkiyah* (menorah) from right to left but are kindled from left to right. The newest candle is lit first. On the Shabbat of Hanukkah, kindle the Hanukkah lights first and then the Shabbat candles.

Light the *shamash* (the helper candle) first, using it to kindle the rest of the Hanukkah lights. As you do, say or sing:

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, אשר קדשנו במצותיו,
וצונו להדליק נר של חנוכה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tsivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who hallows us with mitzvot, commanding us to kindle the Hanukkah lights.

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, שעשה נסים לאבותינו
ואמותינו בימים ההם בזמן הזה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, she-asah nisim laavoteinu v'imoteinu bayamim hahaeim baz'man hazeh.

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of all, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors in days of old at this season.

For first night only:

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, שהחיינו וקיימנו
והגיענו לזמן הזה.

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam, shehecheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higiyanu laz'man hazeh.

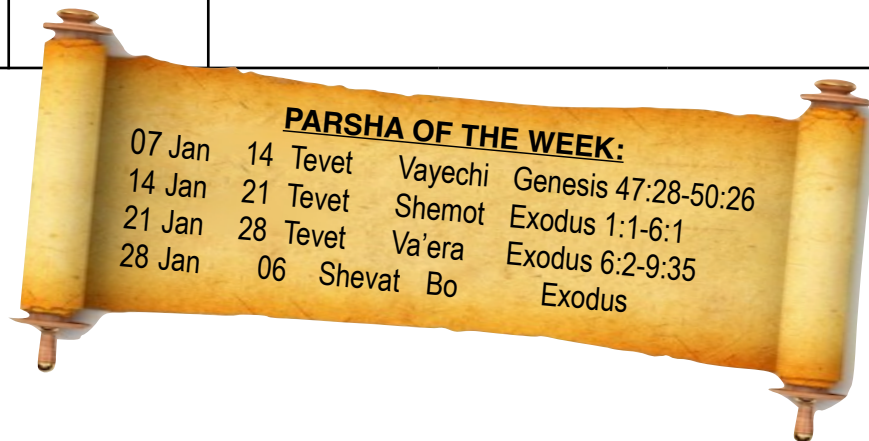


