# From the President Blessings at the Bimah

Many temple members were certain that she could never be replaced. Truth be told, it wasn't easy.

In December of 2021 we formed a search committee to look for a new leader and surveyed temple members about what they desired in a rabbi. Not surprisingly, the profile turned out to be pretty similar to that of Rabbi Medwin. The search committee entreated the CCAR (Central

Conference of American Rabbis) to find a candidate for us, to no avail, which wasn't surprising given our limited resources and remote location. The committee then resorted to word-of-mouth searching and received a recommendation for The Levins, who had been singing once a month at Agudas Achim in Livingston Manor. In early April 2022 we interviewed this musical couple, loved them, and hired them! But they were already booked at Agudas Achim for the High Holy Days and the first Friday of each month. What to do?

An accomplished duo in the folk music world, <mark>Ira and Julia Levin</mark> have been song leaders at Congregation Beth El, South Orange NJ; East End



Temple; NYC; Union Temple, Brooklyn, NY; JCCs in NYC, Berkeley, and San Francisco, and many other Jewish venues. Ira has a BFA in Theater from Florida State University, and Julia has a BFA in Music and Education from Briar Cliff University, Sioux City, IA. For 10 years, she sang internationally on tour with the women's acapella ensemble Vocolot.

We had been exploring "find-a-rabbi" websites, and responses were starting to come in. It was an eyeopener to find that there were quite a number of "pop-up rabbis" within

Rabbi Joshua Gray school, led services, and served as a cantorial soloist at Temple Beth El/Congregation Shaaray T'filah, Glens Falls. NY. His Semicha is from the transdenominational



Rabbinical Seminary International, NYC. With a BA in Psychology from Pennsylvania State University, Rabbi Josh currently works as a director of a mental health facility in Glens Falls, NY. His talented wife and co-leader, Meghan, has a BA in Music from Winthrop University, Rock Hill, SC. reasonable driving distance of Temple Sholom. Among them were another musical couple, **The Grays.** What a find! They agreed to spend the 2022 holidays with us here in Monticello. (Thank you Millers, for hosting.) Both the singing and the commentary were terrific. If all goes well (b'ezrat ha Shem) they will be back with us for the High Holy Days this year.



Our own highly knowledgeable **Ira Simon** helped us out by leading services on those problematic first Fridays, and sometimes on the fifth Friday of the month as well, preparing an insightful D'var Torah each time he was at the Bimah. And Gail Abramowitz cadged an invitation to join an Australian congregation on other Fridays (their Saturday morning service), so we got to meet **Rabbi Shoshana Kaminsky**, another delightful service leader.

**Rabbi Shoshana Kaminsky** was originally from Chevy Chase, MD. She served as rabbi at Beth Samuel Jewish Center outside of Pittsburgh before she signed on at Beit Shalom Synagogue in Adelaide, South Australia in 2006, which became a base for her liberal



activism. Rabbi Kaminsky has led congregations in Birmingham, UK, and Jakarta, Indonesia. Her rabbinic degree is from the Reconstructionist Rabbinical College, Wyncote, PA.

Wonder of wonders, miracle of miracles – **Rabbi Chuck Diamond** recently moved to Smallwood – right in our neighborhood! He is willing to help out on those "orphan" Fridays. We recently enjoyed his first turn at the Bimah and look forward to many more.

Rabbi Chuck Diamond was ordained by the Jewish Theological Seminary. He was assistant rabbi at Temple Israel of Great Neck and directed the Youth House. Moving to Southfield, MI, he became Rabbi of Education and Youth at Congregation Shaarey Tzedek, followed by 14 years at Beth Shalom in Pittsburgh. He founded Congregation Or L'Simcha, which later merged with Tree of



Life. Rabbi Chuck spent 45 summers with kids at Camp Ramah in Canada. He has a BA in Social Relations and a Masters of Public Management from Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh.

No complaints. We've experienced a rich and varied assortment of Shabbat services and will continue to do so. I hope you are all enjoying our foray into rabbinic diversity.

## **Course description:**

For those of you who do not know me, my name is Rabbi Joshua Gray, and I am an independent rabbi who also works as a director in the field of mental health. I have put together a class/discussion entitled, *"Through a Jewish Lens: Mental Health and Wellness"*. This class will focus on gaining an understanding of mental health as a continuum of wellness,



and how this important aspect of oneself is so vital to the wellbeing of a whole person. We will look at some of the facts regarding mental health and wellness in terms of prevalence rates and impact, signs and symptoms that someone is struggling, how to engage in true self-care ("Im ein ani li mi li - If I am not for myself; who will be for me?"- R. Hillel), and how to help someone in need. The class will also tackle the important issue of historical trauma, which is written into the Jewish experience.




