# From the President

#### You never get a second chance to make a first impression

You've surely noticed the gorgeous floral displays outside our front doors. They certainly impress anybody who passes our building or enters our doors. Since 2006, Carolyn Richman and her helpers on the Beautification Committee have put on their gardening gloves and rolled up their shirtsleeves to make our entrance beautiful.

Stalwarts of her committee, Beth Leidner and Lauren Miller, take turns watering, and Pat Halprin stands by as a backup. They also periodically weed and deadhead the flowers so that they will keep blooming.

Carolyn recalls tending flowerbeds that she designed along the front and side of the building. The Beautification Committee applied for and won a \$1000 Sullivan Renaissance grant in 2006 for "Best Container in a Single Location" The original flower gardens were created in 2008 with the help of devoted temple volunteers and TS religious school students, as well as Sullivan Renaissance workers, winning an additional \$1000 Sullivan Renaissance prize. In 2015 they were awarded another \$1,000 prize for maintenance.

Additional funding comes from the annual spring plant sale. Earnings have enabled the Committee to maintain the gardens as well as donate a much needed linoleum floor downstairs (installed by Jerry Bogursky), shades for the windows in the sanctuary, and shrubs on the temple grounds.

# A Message from Your Treasurer

You should have already received your dues invoice for the 2023-24 fiscal year by regular mail. I have billed everyone according to the dues structure in our budget and it reflects a 6% increase. If you are presently on dues remission in any amount, you must submit a new Application for Special Consideration. When I receive your form I will adjust your dues to reflect your needs. I included the form with your invoice if you did not return the form I sent to you last month. Our Constitution requires a new application every year.

I am also requesting that all members pay in full or by quarterly installments rather than monthly. Bookkeeping becomes overwhelming and I appreciate your understanding. If you use Billpay from your bank, be sure that payments are actually being paid. It is up to the member to keep track of payments made. Members under Special Consideration may continue to pay as they have been paying.

I hope that you are renewing your membership, but in the event that you are not, you must submit a letter to me indicating that you are leaving the Temple. If it is for financial reasons, please request an Application for Special Consideration. If your dues are unpaid, please understand that you will no longer have cemetery privileges. If you need a cemetery plot in the future, you will be billed as a non-member. You must also be a member in good standing in order to attend High Holy Day services at no charge in September. The definition of a member in good standing is in the Constitution that was sent to all members prior to our Annual meeting that was held in May.




