From the President

AN OUNCE OF PREVENTION

It is said that the devil can quote the bible for his own purpose. Many verses in the Tanach say the equivalent of "The Lord will protect you from all evil," (Psalm 121:7), but then there's this:

"A prudent man sees harm and hides, but fools pass through and are punished."

--Proverbs 22:3

I tend to take the more optimistic view, but opportunity knocked in the form of an email from Rick Stein in late 2022, drawing my attention to the *Securing Communities Against Hate Crimes* program for nonprofit organizations at risk of a hate crime attack. The Federal Government was allocating millions of dollars to the states to combat terrorism. About fifty million dollars was to be available to New York State to fund about 1000 projects. This grant was to be administered by the NYS Division of Criminal Justice.

Despite my sanguine belief that Temple Sholom is a backwater that is relatively safe from terrorism, I couldn't pass this up. In my younger days as a research biologist, I had applied for many Federal grants, so I figured this couldn't be too hard. But that was before grant applications became digital. Oy!

It seemed that we couldn't even apply for the grant money until New York State "prequalified" Temple Sholom via a website called "Grants Gateway."

This involved proving our nonprofit status (We are not a 501(c) organization, but an equivalent.), submitting our Certificate of Incorporation from 1954 (Village of Monticello has lost it, but Marty Miller had a copy.), providing profiles of our Board members (had to ask for those), uploading our corporate bylaws (which needed updating), showing audit information (never

been audited), certifying that we have workman's comp (had to locate documents), having an employee code of conduct (we created one), etc., etc. Four months after

starting the process, I had managed to get us "prequalified," just in time to submit the grant application before the deadline.

Then came the grant application itself. This required showing that we were at risk of hate crimes and that we have many vulnerabilities. It was eye opening to learn that we do indeed have vulnerabilities. Some of these, such as foliage that screened the building, were promptly corrected by our Building Committee. Others, such as lack of safety training for our congregants, are being corrected now. About navigating the Government websites, don't ask! I became very cozy with the Division of Criminal Justice help desk folks.

Thankfully, our Board members provided many suggestions to strengthen the three grant applications to the NYS Department of Criminal Justice that were submitted in February. In July we learned that we have been awarded two of them, for a total of \$99,720.

A Blessing or a Curse?

The security grants will fund upgrades for our elevator, bollards and fencing to prevent vehicle access to the building, surveillance cameras, reinforced doors to create a safe room, a PA system for emergency alerts, and window coatings to prevent shatter. These are great improvements, but quite a bit of work is involved on our part.

The grant does not allow for personnel or administrative costs. Under a government contract, we will be required to get three estimates for each project—and we all know how much time is involved in getting estimates from contractors around here. In addition, detailed bookkeeping, accounting, and reporting will be required. Worries about record keeping are keeping me up at night.

I am counting on the support of our wonderful volunteers to get us through this. If you have the knowledge and expertise to help, please contact me soon to relieve my anxiety. In the meantime, stay safe!

A Message from Hazzan Laura Mandeles

Dear Temple Sholom Congregation,

High Holidays will be coming up before you know it. While most people are slowing down for summer, rabbis and cantors are getting into "HiHo" high gear. I feel privileged to be leading



Temple Sholom High Holiday services this year, and to be working with a group of really dedicated Temple Sholom volunteers to put it all together.

A little about me: A longtime cantorial soloist, I earned a Certificate in Jewish Sacred Music from Hebrew College in Boston in 2017 and entered the ALEPH Ordination Program the same year. I received *smicha* (ordination) as a "Hazzan" in January. The ALEPH program teaches from a Jewish Renewal perspective. Renewal services combine the traditional with the innovative, building on a Hasidic heritage to create a Judaism that is accessible and meaningful to people from all sorts of backgrounds.

Services with me will probably be different than your past experience. I'm a Hazzan (cantor in Hebrew), not a rabbi. So, I sing—a lot. There will be many types of musical prayer: traditional nusach (modal prayer chanting), *niggunim* (singing without words—lai, lai, lai or dai, dai, dai, or anything you want really), familiar High Holiday melodies, contemporary Jewish songs, and ancient *mi Sinai* melodies. We'll talk more about that at services, and no, *mi Sinai* melodies did not come down the mountain with Moses.

I will use my guitar during the evening service for Rosh Hashana, and perhaps a bit in the morning services, but otherwise I will sing a cappella (without accompaniment). This means you all have to sing with me as much as you can! And if you don't know the words, sing your niggun syllables.

Rules of the House: 1. No matter what you do, you are not wrong and no one can tell you that you're doing it wrong; 2. If you want to sit when everyone is standing, please sit, even when I ask everyone to stand. 3. You can also stand (off to the side) when everyone is sitting; 4. Please take a break whenever you need to—I didn't schedule a break during Rosh Hashanah services. Just please try not to leave if the ark is open.

<u>Warning</u>: I will make mistakes, I will lose my place, I will forget the melody, I will start on a note that leaves everybody in an extremely high vocal register, I will call a mulligan and start stuff over.

Despite all that, my intention throughout will be to fulfill my sacred role as *Shlichat tsibur*—your emissary to the Divine.


