HIGH HOLY DAYS - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

All services will be hybrid except Tashlich, which will be held at DeHoyos Park in Monticello following Rosh Hashanah services on the second day. If you plan to do Tashlich on your own, please send an email to Ellen Nesin at nesineh49@gmail.com, and she will send the booklet to you that the Cantor will be using.

- **Tickets will not be mailed out.** You will receive your invitation to services in an email if you are a member in good standing, i.e., your dues are paid in full or other arrangements have been made with Ellen Nesin, our Treasurer.
- The ticket cost is \$50 for a relative of a Temple Sholom member and \$100 for non-members. Contact the office to purchase additional tickets.
- A dedicated Zoom link will be emailed to members and anyone who has purchased a "ticket."
- If you share the link with non-members, please encourage them to send a donation to the temple for the amount we are charging.
- The link will not be the same as the one we use for Shabbat services.



From the President

PREPARING FOR THE HOLIDAYS

I don't know how things were in your house, but when I was growing up, the High Holidays had a lot to do with clothes. Mom needed two new outfits, one for Rosh Hashanah plus some kind of white outfit for Yom Kippur. And then there was the ruckus about what my dad was going to wear so he shouldn't look like a schlump.

The services themselves were another ordeal. The cantor at my shul warbled long operatic detours that made each prayer interminable. I spent time counting how many pages were left until the end of the morning service. For me, the most entertaining part of High Holiday services was "hat watching."

Times have changed. How many of us are buying a new outfit this year, let alone a hat?

Getting ready for the Holidays is a whole different thing here at Temple Sholom. The many moving parts require all the energy that a committee can muster. Here is a rough calendar of what goes into it:

May: Search for a service leader, interview candidates.

June: Contract with the service leader (in our case, Hazzan Laura Mandeles). Confer on aspects of ritual (such as whether to blow the shofar or recite Avinu Malkeinu) that are not traditionally done when Erev Rosh Hashanah overlaps Shabbat. Select the Torah reading to chant on Day 2 of Rosh Hashanah.

July: Determine who will chant from the Torah and whether it is OK for a Torah portion to be chanted online. Discuss whether to use visual tefillah or prayer books for each of the ten services (Erev Rosh Hashanah, Rosh Hashanah Morning, Second Day Rosh Hashanah, Tashlich, Kol Nidrei, Erev Yom Kippur, Yom Kippur Morning, Healing/Comfort Service, Yom Kippur Afternoon, Yizkor Service, N'eila, and Havdalah). Recruit shofar blower.

August: Develop service menus, locate readings in the prayerbook, select parts to assign to congregants. Determine how much of the Haftarah (Jonah) to read. Survey members of the congregation about whether and when they would like honors. Assign board members to sit on Bimah and Ira Simon to serve as Gabbai. Organize

accommodations for Hazzan Laura. Order flowers for the bimah. Assign ushers. Write and publicize the service schedule.

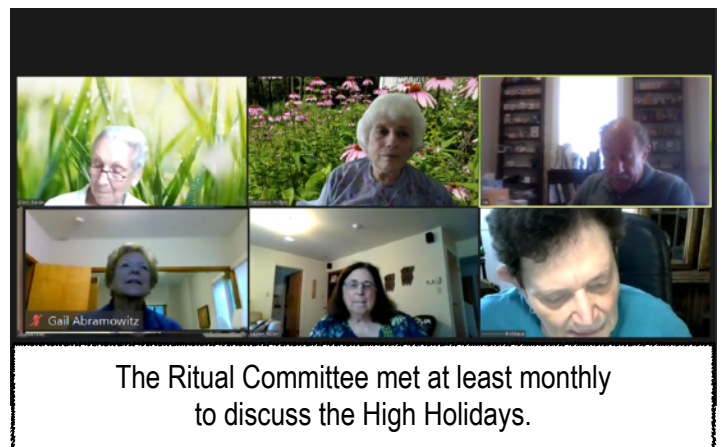
September: Format Hazzan Laura's PowerPoint for the temple's Mac computer. Coordinate procedures with Hazzan Laura. Copy readings and distribute to participants. Assemble Wall of Remembrance. Take orders for Yiskor book. Contact village police to ensure security. Order food for Kiddush and break-the-fast. Print Yiskor book. Set up for Erev Rosh Hashanah and break-the-fast. Remind readers and ushers when to be at temple. Set up chairs and audio equipment. Replace prayer books with High Holiday Machzors. Test technology with Hazzan Laura. Open Torah scrolls to correct spot.

September 15: Thank the hardworking members of the Ritual Committee for their many hours of meetings and phone calls.

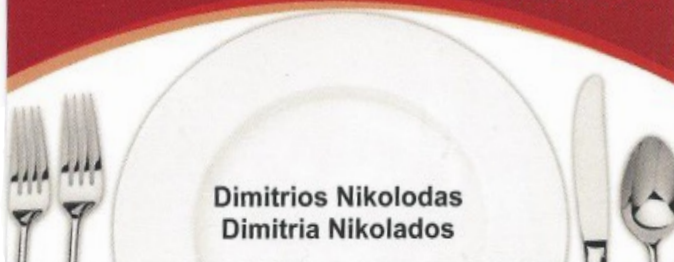

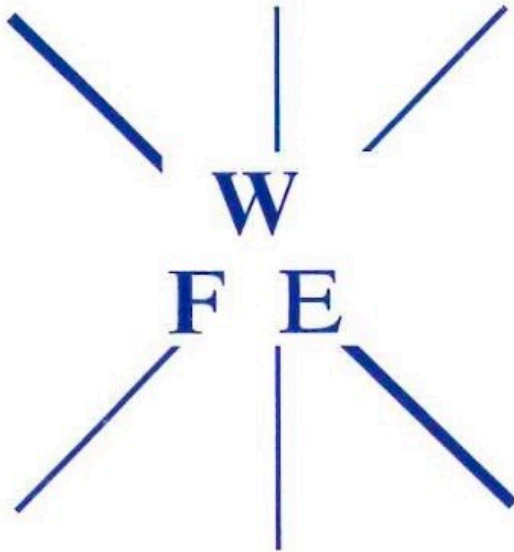

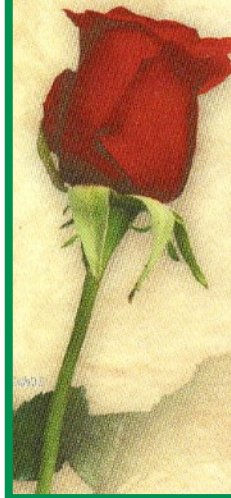
