From the President



We're lucky to be living in the Catskills. Though we bemoan the absence of Jewish children in our religious school, we can't complain that Jewish history has been forgotten here.

The Liberty Museum and Arts Center in Liberty, NY, has featured an exhibition called *Voices of Survivors: Inspiring Hope, Sanctuary, Compassion and Community*. This exhibition started as a daffodil garden to commemorate the 1.5 million children who perished during the Holocaust. The museum mounted an exhibit of photographs, paintings, and poetry that memorialize this horrific period in Jewish history. It followed up with a series of speakers whom the Nazi genocide touched directly. I managed to be at three presentations that members of our congregation gave. They each had a different story, and each story was hair-raising.

Rick Stein's grandfather had a department store in Vienna and was an influential Jewish leader there. His four daughters managed to escape the Holocaust, two with him. Through influence, friends, and bribery, they got visas to Cuba and left by train from Vienna to Hamburg. A cruise ship, the Saint Louis, took them to Cuba but was refused harbor anywhere in North America and had to return to Europe. Rick's family ended up as illegal aliens in England, and around 1940 they were able to get to the US.

Most of **Shain Fishman's** family in Lukow, was killed, but her mother hid in the woods as a partisan fighter. Shain says to read her mother's book, *My Life, My Way* by Eta Wrobel, to learn their story. She says the Holocaust has impacted her whole life. She found her family's stories hard to process and is still affected by them.

A third descendent of Holocaust survivors, **Mimi Werner**, told her parents' story at a Primetimers meeting. Her father, Herman Lewinter, was a gifted studio photographer in Zolochiv, South East Poland, which is now part of Ukraine. This line of work stood him in good stead, as he secretly photographed the atrocities in Janowska, the concentration camp in Lviv (then in Poland). He was able to reduce the negatives in size and smuggle them out through the trench under the fence that he surreptitiously dug to escape, along with his wife, niece, and 16 other prisoners. His photos bore witness at the Nuremberg Trials. (*see below*)

Though my family was safe in the US, these stories haunt me every day and keep me awake at night. We must keep the stories alive so that such horror never happens again.

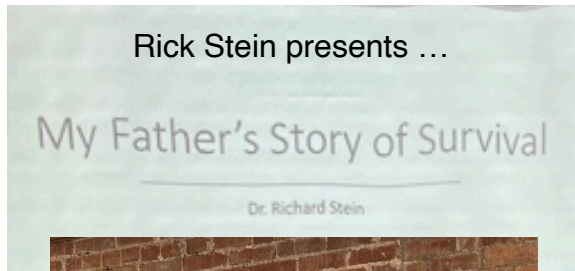

Rabbi Molly Karp to Lead High Holiday Services

We are fortunate this year to have Rabbi Molly Karp leading our High Holiday services. Rabbi Karp has strong credentials as a Jewish educator. She was ordained by the Academy for Jewish Religion in Yonkers, New York, which has a pluralistic approach to Jewish learning. The Academy teaches across the various Jewish approaches, from Orthodox to Reform.



A multitalented individual, Rabbi Karp sings and accompanies herself on guitar. For the High Holidays, she will conduct services using our High Holiday prayerbooks. She will not be using slides.

Rabbi Karp has a longstanding interest in Jewish education, having earned a Masters degree in Religious Education from Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion, in 1982. She also spent 10 years studying Bible and Ancient Semitic languages at the Jewish Theological Seminary. Since 2016, Rabbi Karp has conducted online courses as the creator of S.A.J.E., her Senior Adult Jewish Education school. Her erudition will be in evidence during her sermons. So, the Holidays will be a learning experience as well as a time to contemplate.

Temple Sholom has **JNF tree certificates** that we will send out in honor of or in memory of a loved one. JNF has worked for decades with all of the communities on the Gaza border. 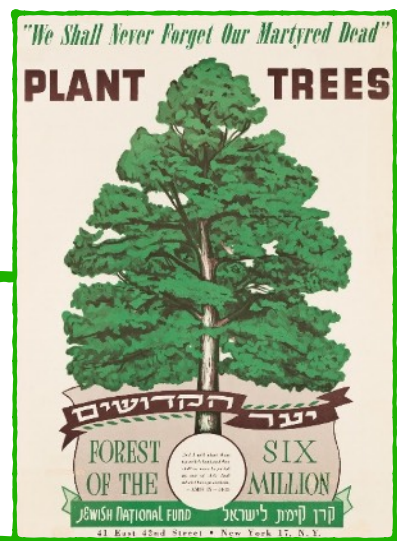
Gold Book - Mishkan Hanefesh - Machzor for the Days of Awe - **Rosh Hashanah**

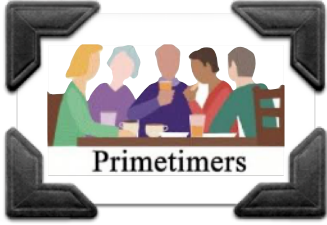

The PrimeTimers is the fund-raising arm of Temple Sholom, the reform temple in Monticello. It also provides funds to the Hospice of Orange and Sullivan Counties, the Federation for the Homeless, and the Nessin Cultural Arts Center. The majority of the group's fundraising activities take place during the summer months.

Moreover, the PrimeTimers promotes Jewish culture, Jewish education, and Jewish awareness, both within and throughout the community. Membership is open to both Temple Sholom members and non-members no matter a person's religion, race, or ethnicity.

The Group has two standing committees: 1) Fundraising and 2) Programming. The Fundraising committee organizes events, projects, or activities for the purpose of collecting additional income for the PrimeTimers. The Programming committee arranges programs and presentations to benefit its membership by providing information on issues of Jewish importance or interest.

The group enjoys monthly socials, special events, various trips, and an annual Card Party & Mah Jongg event. Annual dues are minimal (*currently \$10 per person annually*) and include a subscription to the monthly Harbinger newsletter, a Golden Book on the members' birthdays and priority access to PrimeTimer events and trips.

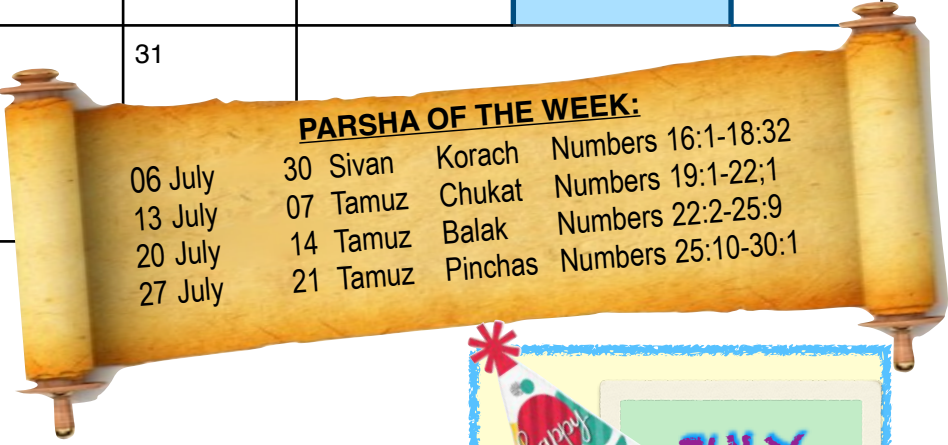

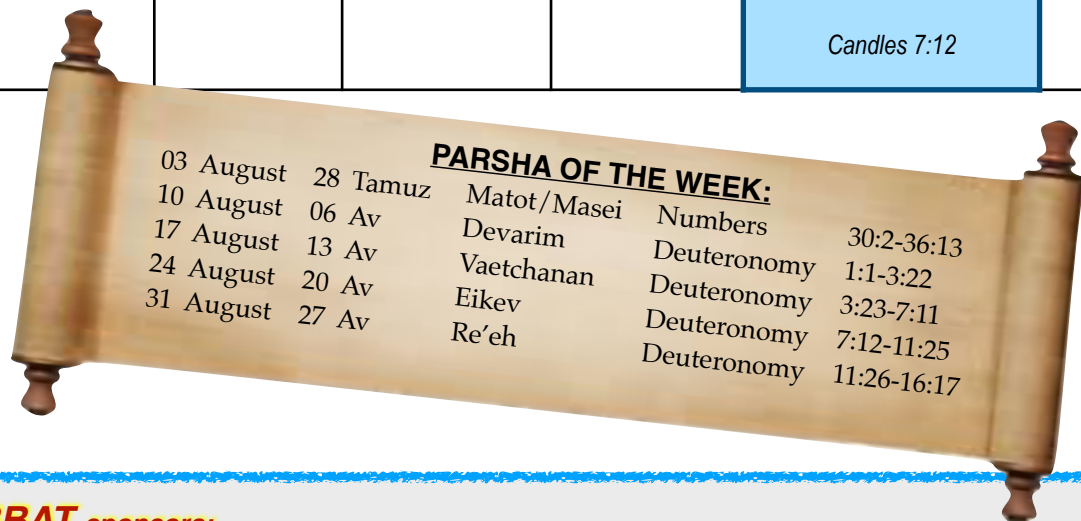

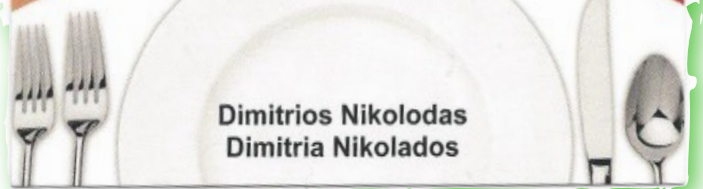
