From the President.... Apples and Honey

My son-in-law, Brett, has an apple orchard. As orchards go, it isn't a big orchard. He decided to make it a u-pick orchard and to have only dwarf trees, so he wouldn't have to worry about people climbing or falling from them.

How did he do that? He bought an assortment of varieties of apple that had been grafted onto root stock for dwarf trees. The result was a variety of apples growing on trees that only reached about six feet high. The trees had to be trellased so that they could support a lot of apples.

Brett made sure that the varieties he grew ripened at different times. Our Hassidic neighbors picked all the early varieties before returning to Brooklyn a month ago. They were relieved to know that the trees are old enough. (The Talmud forbids picking from trees less than three years old.) He had to close the orchard for a couple of weeks while he waited for the later varieties to ripen.

The orchard is busy this time of year. Families come to have fun picking apples. If you come, you'll find plenty to go with your honey for Rosh Hashanah. Wishing you all an abundantly sweet 5785!






