From the President



Moving Right Along

It's been a year since the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services awarded us a security grant. It took a while to get ourselves into gear, but now we are moving. We've gotten metal doors to replace the less secure wooden ones in the kitchen and on the lower level. The kitchen doors lock from the inside. This will make the kitchen into a "safe room," in the unlikely event that we need one.

The new steel doors on the lower level are complemented by metal mesh over the windows. The improvements down there not only improve security but certainly look better than before. Steve Rodriguez also remounted our front door, so hopefully we'll have less trouble with it.

You may have noticed the large boulders that now surround the temple premises. These are spaced in such a way that they can prevent a vehicle from crashing into the building. We still have to close the gap in the back, but we are mostly protected. Our plan for the back is to put in fencing with a gate, preferably one that can be operated remotely. We have to thank Mike Taylor for donating the boulders from Holiday Mountain. We also have Glen Fodor to thank for putting them in place so quickly.

And then there's the elevator. It's not working right at the moment, but Accessibility Solutions will come this week to fix it.

We're still awaiting an upgrade on our alarm system. But all in all, we've done quite a bit to improve our security. And there's more to come.

Next project – High Holidays. Are you ready?

I was so upset I think my passengers were more upset looking at me than they were about the bus. Maybe we shouldn't be riding on a bus to the city with mechanical problems. The people who had tickets managed to drive, take trains or busses and enjoyed their day.

We will be issuing refunds at our next meeting. For next season I booked Leprechaun Lines for June 18 and August 13.

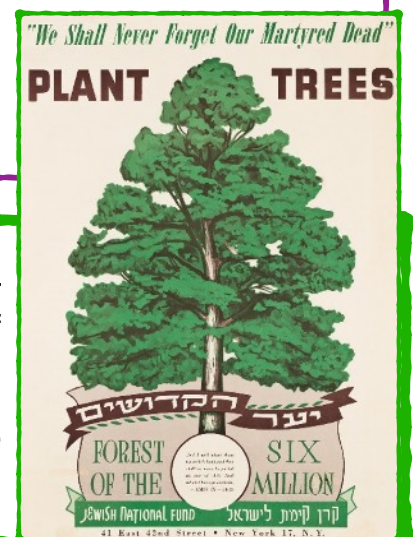
There are still some members who have not paid their \$10 annual dues. Please do so at this meeting so we can have a great renewal rate.

Rabbi Molly Karp to Lead High Holiday Services

We are fortunate this year to have Rabbi Molly Karp leading our High Holiday services. Rabbi Karp has strong credentials as a Jewish educator. She was ordained by the Academy for Jewish Religion in Yonkers, New York, which has a pluralistic approach to Jewish learning. The Academy teaches across the various Jewish approaches, from Orthodox to Reform.



A multitalented individual, Rabbi Karp sings and accompanies herself on guitar. For the High Holidays, she will conduct services using our High Holiday prayerbooks. She will not be using slides.

Rabbi Karp has a longstanding interest in Jewish education, having earned a Masters degree in Religious Education from Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion, in 1982. She also spent 10 years studying Bible and Ancient Semitic Languages at the Jewish Theological Seminary. Since 2016, Rabbi Karp has conducted online courses as the creator of S.A.J.E., her Senior Adult Jewish Education school. Her

erudition will be in evidence during her sermons. So, the Holidays will be a learning experience as well as a time to contemplate.
