



CHANUKAH CANDLE LIGHTING

One candle is added to the hanukkiyah (9-branch menorah) each night.

The first night, you light the **shamash** (the one at a different height) and one Hanukkah candle. By the eighth night, you light all of the candles.

Candles are added to the hanukkiyah from right to left (like Hebrew writing).

Add the number of candles corresponding to the night of Hanukkah.

Light the **shamash** and hold it while reciting the blessings. **Do not light the other candles until the blessings are done!**Then use the shamash to light from left to right with the newest candle lit first.




