

Yom HaZikaron laShoah velaG'vurah (Holocaust and Heroism



Remembrance Day), known as Yom HaShoah, is observed as Israel's day of commemoration for the approximately six million Jews murdered in the Shoah (catastrophe/disaster) by Nazi Germany and its allies, and for the Jewish resistance in that period. In Israel, it is a national memorial day. The first official commemorations took place in 1951, and the observance of the day was anchored in a law passed by the Knesset in 1959. It is held on the 27th of Nisan. The date was chosen to mark the anniversary of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising, symbolizing Jewish resistance and resilience in the face of unimaginable adversity.



From the President....



Keeping Safe

Antisemitic acts in the US have more than doubled since the start of the war in Gaza. To our relief, antisemitic attacks have not been a problem in our area. Nevertheless, as a safety precaution, Temple Sholom applied for and received almost \$100,000 in grant money from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice to improve security on our premises. This money has allowed us to greatly strengthen security at our facility.

Over the past two years, here's what we have done with the grant money:



- 1. We replaced the rickety old elevator with an attractive and functioning wheelchair lift to allow more efficient evacuation of the building in an emergency.
- 2. We upgraded our alarm system and installed closed circuit video surveillance cameras with playback capabilities around the outside of the building.
- 3. We surrounded the perimeter of our property with boulders to prevent potential vehicle attack.




- 4. We replaced the deteriorating basement door and installed wire mesh around the basement windows.
 - 5. We upgraded the front door so it opens and locks more easily.
 - 6. We installed two metal doors to the kitchen so it can now be used as a "safe room" in an emergency.



In the next few months we will complete the protective barrier around our building by installing a gate to close off the perimeter of the property where it remains open.

Despite these improvements, some vulnerabilities remain. It is up to us, the congregants, to remain alert to the possibility of hate crimes. We have instituted short announcements at services to remind congregants to keep their eyes and ears open. We all must do our part.







We were very moved by the joyous gathering of our Temple Sholom and Agudas Achim communities online for Purim. It was as if we could hear Rabbi Pomerantz (z'l) cheering us all on, heartily, from above. We have two loving independent communities with their own beautiful temples and legacies - and Dayenu! It's enough! And as Rabbi Fred had hoped for us, we will always share our blessings and remain open for collaborations such as these.

Who needs tarot when you have the Torah? It is

apparent, time and again, that the Torah is and always will be here to help guide us. Just as the Israelites gathered their different tribes and their Egyptian neighbors to venture into the wilderness towards the unknown where the Torah awaited them, our connection and strength in Sullivan County is a blessing as we are all setting forth in this time of uncertainty.

It is a time where not only the Jewish community but education, the environment, our national parks and the beauty they preserve for our children, our health systems, women's rights, and the rights of various minority groups' lifestyles, dignity and freedoms are seriously being threatened. Our solidarity with one another, regardless of our varied opinions, will allow us to

receive the wisdom of Torah, to strengthen our commitment to tikkun olam, the repairing of the world, if not for ourselves, then for our children.

Before we return to in-person services on April 25, we will have another opportunity to bolster our inter-congregational alliance. We are once again invited to join Agudas Achim online on April 4, for our Shabbat service. That service, and the one on April 11, will both be preparing us for, and guiding us towards celebrating Passover in a meaningful way.

We are so grateful for you all and seriously take heart in the sense of family that we have witnessed unfolding over the years. May you be well and continue to know joy and generate light.



The Executive Committee of the Sullivan County Legislature approved the **Daffodil Garden Project** for Fall 2025. After a presentation by Dr. Hope Blecher, with the assistance of Mr. Martin Colavito, they passed a resolution for 3000 yellow daffodils to be planted in the area near Bicentennial Park. The date and time to be announced.

OUR MISSION

The Daffodil Project aspires to build a worldwide Living Holocaust Memorial by planting 1.5 million daffodils in memory of the children who perished in the Holocaust and in support for children suffering in humanitarian crises in the world today.

What will the ceremony and planting look like?

This project is a collaborative effort. Hope will be speaking with the representatives of the county, the people at the Daffodil Project, and the benefactor. For general information, the event will be between mid-September and mid-October 2025, avoiding the High Holy Days.




