Last Blast

At the upcoming board meeting we will ponder a budget for next year. Ellen Nesin and I have worked hard to hold down expenditures during my terms as president. With the increased dues last year and careful money management, the temple has moved into the black.

Once again we have to consider what is likely to happen during the coming year. The inflation rate in the US during the past 12 months was roughly 4%. With the current financial volatility of our country, it seems likely to remain at about that level for the next 12 months. This will impact our costs for electricity, fuel, maintenance, and salaries. We therefore ask, with apologies, to raise dues by 4%.

On the Bright Side

We managed to spend almost all our grant money in the two years that the grant was in effect. The fence (see photo below) is the last security improvement. The temple building is now well protected from any possibility of vehicular attack.

The Levins will continue to lead services in the coming year, and we will be able to Zoom into services that they lead at Agudas Achim. The Levins' spirit has gone a long way toward cementing a feeling of community at Temple Sholom and, as Ira Levin says, we are grateful.

In an exciting development, we now house an exhibit entitled "Voices of the Survivors." The exhibit honors Holocaust survivors and their rescuers with letters, audio recordings, books, and other memorabilia. (see pages 6-7)

Performances during the summer will bring the exhibit to life. On Sunday, July 20, duo Fisher and Kean will perform songs selected for the exhibit's theme. On Sunday, August 17, Chai on Music will perform klezmer style songs, and on Sunday, September 14, artist Allie Luci will paint for us on location while she shares her story. Tickets are \$15 each.

It was the desire of Rabbi Fred Pomerantz that we would occasionally explore the origin of certain songs within our newsletters. This month, which has much to celebrate, we were additionally nudged by a fellow congregant and inspired by a mere set of notes...a melody...that had a mission to unite.

As our Passover celebrations and the counting of the Omer remind us, the journey is just as important as is the destination, and there is always hope for what is to come. May brings blossoms and green that draw us back outdoors to revel in Spring. There's a sense of renewal and as our creek flows with the strength of a river, we are reminded of a song that draws from a centuriesold folk melody that has traversed time.

This 16th century melody gained popularity in Renaissance Europe as it was adapted and wandered within songs of Poland, Romania, Scotland, and Ukraine. It finally gained a lasting foothold, fittingly, in Smetana's, "Moldeau," as well as the prayerful song that we have come to know as "Hatikvah."

"Hatikvah" (Hebrew: הַתִּקְנָה, lit. 'The Hope')

"As long as in the heart within,
The Jewish soul yearns,
And toward the eastern edges, onward,
An eye gazes toward Zion.
Our hope is not yet lost,
The hope that is two-thousand years old,
To be a free nation in our land,
The Land of Zion, Jerusalem."

In the 1870's, Naftali Imber, a Jewish poet from Austrian Poland (now part of Ukraine), penned a poem of "profound hope and longing" which Shmuel Cohen would set to a melody that he knew from Romania - the same melody that Smetana was inspired by for his symphonic set, entitled, "Má vlast" or "My Homeland." And yes, "Hatikvah," the song that resonated so powerfully with the Jewish farmers, helped spread the message of homeland throughout the Zionist communities. These notes were destined to serve.

Hatikva's relevance and inspiration were challenged vehemently each decade. There were times that it was not allowed to be played, yet "The Moldeau" could be performed, and those notes continued to slyly provide unification. Hatikvah became so undeniable that it was sung in the camps of Auschwitz and eventually embraced by the newly established State of Israel in 1948. But even so, "Hatikvah" was not officially recognized as the national anthem until November of 2004.

As we intone this prayerful song together, we can reflect on how many souls have been swayed by the yearning of this melody, heartened and aligned with these holy words. We can feel the significance of its impact on Israel, our communities, in our own lives as it has wended its way into our time.

We, too, wind like rivers that converge. We each have something vital to offer, individual voices that harmonize and gain strength within our congregation. May our own melodies of life continue to have a lasting significance that resonates deeply in our communities. May our hope continue to thrive as we serve from a loving space that offers a sense of unity to the Jewish people and to the world.






Author Talk




unbreakable bonds between women. This is a gripping historical fiction you won't want to miss hearing about.


