



#### Rabbi Molly Karp to Lead High Holiday Services

We are fortunate this year again to have Rabbi Molly Karp leading our High Holiday services. Rabbi Molly Karp is a deep listener, a skilled counselor and a pluralistic rabbi, passionate about teaching Torah, Hebrew and many other facets of Judaism. Rabbi Karp holds a Master's degree in Jewish Education from HUC-JIR in New York and a BA in Judaic Studies from SUNY Binghamton. She spent ten years in doctoral studies in Hebrew Bible at the Jewish Theological Seminary, and was later ordained as a rabbi at the Academy for Jewish Religion in Riverdale, NY. Rabbi Karp offers an extensive catalogue of online courses in Bible, Jewish studies, and Hebrew language courses for adult learners, including laypeople, ordained Jewish clergy, and rabbinic and cantorial students, in her organization S.A.J.E.



Senior Adult Jewish Education, a community of learners. Her training in Mindfulness Practice and Jewish Spirituality is at the heart of all of her work. Rabbi Karp's erudition will be in evidence during her sermons. So, the Holy Days will be a learning experience as well as a time to contemplate.


