Rabbi Molly Karp to Lead High Holiday Services

We are fortunate this year again to have Rabbi Molly Karp leading our High Holiday services. Rabbi Molly Karp is a deep listener, a skilled counselor and a pluralistic rabbi, passionate about teaching Torah, Hebrew and many other facets of Judaism. Rabbi Karp holds a Master's degree in Jewish Education from HUC-JIR in New York and a BA in Judaic Studies from SUNY Binghamton. She spent ten years in doctoral studies in Hebrew Bible at the Jewish Theological Seminary, and was later ordained as a rabbi at the Academy for Jewish Religion in Riverdale, NY. Rabbi Karp offers an extensive catalogue of online courses in Bible, Jewish studies, and Hebrew language courses for adult learners, including laypeople,



ordained Jewish clergy, and rabbinic and cantorial students, in her organization S.A.J.E. Senior Adult Jewish Education, a community of learners. Her training in Mindfulness Practice and Jewish Spirituality is at the heart of all of her work. Rabbi Karp's erudition will be in evidence during her sermons. So, the Holy Days will be a learning experience as well as a time to contemplate.

It's hard to believe it's almost Rosh Hashana! Rosh Hashana is on the 1st and 2nd of Tishrei, which is September 23rd and 24th this year. We are delighted to have Rabbi Molly Karp return to lead services for all of the holidays.

It is remarkable that we live in a day and age where we can have services in person as well as on Zoom, so even those far away from the temple can participate. Members get the link at no charge; family members will pay \$50 for the link, and non-members will pay \$100 for link access. Prices are the same for in-person tickets: \$50 for members' family and \$100 for non-members. Anyone wishing to attend Yizkor may do so at no fee, though donations are greatly appreciated.

Giving is fundamental to Jewish belief and practice. We put our money where our mouths are. The temple is, and has been for the past seven decades, central to the lives of its members. As such I urge you to make that extra donation to Temple Sholom in keeping with the tradition of the High Holy days.

It's always nice to see so many congregants together in the sanctuary. Hearing everyone's voices come together lifts my prayers up even higher. Oneg Shabbat means, "The Joy of Shabbat."


